JAMMU: A voter turnout of 69.65 per cent was recorded in the third and final phase of voting Tuesday in the assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir, the Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) said.

Overall after the conclusion of the all three phases, the poll percentage stands at 63.45, which is higher than the turnout recorded in the recently held Lok Sabha elections in the Union Territory, the J&K CEO office said in a statement here.

However, he said the figures are tentative and likely to go up marginally with the final reports from the polling stations in far-flung areas and addition of postal bal-

According to EC data, there were more than 39.18 lakh eligible voters in the final phase.

"Poll percentage in first phase (covering 24 constituencies on September 18) was 61.38 percent, in second phase (covering 26 segments

However, it is slightly less than 65.84 percent in 2014 assembly elections, it said.

Highlighting the districtwise voter turnout in the last three elections -- two assembly polls (in 2008 and 2014) and one Lok Sabha elections

(2024) -- the statement said the overall the poll percentage in the assembly elections in the Kashmir division remained 55.20 per cent against 47.27 per cent in Lok Sabha elections this year.

However, the 55.20 per cent was less than 2014 assembly poll percentage of 65.84 per cent and 2008assembly poll percentage of 61.01 per cent.

Similarly, the 72.59 percentage of the Jammu division recorded during the three phases of assembly elections is higher than 69.63 per cent registered in Lok Sabha elections this year and 71.26 per cent registered in 2008 assembly polls but lower compared to 2014 assembly elections when overall 76.67 per cent polling was registered.

No repoll recorded in J&K assembly polls: EC

NEW DELHI: The Election Commission said no repolls have been recorded so far in the three-phased Jammu and Kashmir assembly polls which concluded on Tuesday. It also noted that despite an increase in the number of assembly seats from 83 in 2014 to 90n 2024, the elections were completed in three phases this time as against five in 2014. No major law and order incidents related to the elections were reported, a significant

improvement from 2014 when over 170 incidents were reported, including 87 on polling days There also have been no complaints pertaining to arbitrary preventive detention of political functionaries in these elections which is "unprecedented", the poll authority said.

The Election Commission (EC) had also strictly instructed against clubbing of polling stations just before the poll day, and accordingly, people voted at their actual polling station loca tion as opposed to 98 polling stations shifted in 2014 at the eleventh hour. The role of money and muscle power has been curtailed to a "significant extent", it said.

These assembly polls have seen a seven per cent increase in the number of candidates con esting as compared to the assembly elections in 2014.

Women candidates made a significant leap, increasing from 28 to 43 in the corresponding period, while independent candidates saw a 26 per cent rise.

Ladakh is stable but not normal and remains sensitive, Chief of Army Staff Gen Upendra Dwivedi said on Tuesday amid the dragging standoff between Indian and Chinese militaries in the region.

Though a "positive signalling" is coming out from the diplomatic talks between the two sides, the execution of any plan depends on the military commanders on the ground, he said.

In the entire gamut, the "trust" has become the "biggest casualty", Gen Dwivedi said at a curtain raiser event on Chanakya Defence Dialogue.

Iran attacks Israel, US warplanes arrive in middle east

JERUSALEM: Iran launched dozens of missiles into Israel on Tuesday, sharply escalating a conflict between Israel and the Iran-backed militias Hezbollah and Hamas that began nearly a year ago and threatening to push the Middle East closer toward a regionwide war.

The orange glow of missiles streaked across Israel's night sky as air raid sirens sounded across the country and millions of residents scrambled into bomb shelters. The attack raised the strong likelihood of an Israeli reprisal.

Before Iran's attack, Israel had landed a series of devastating blows in recent weeks against Hezbollah's leadership in Lebanon. It then ratcheted up the pressure on the militant group - which has been firing rockets into Israel since the war in Gaza began - by launching what it said is a limited ground incursion in southern Lebanon.

Israel has said it will continue to strike Hezbollah until it is safe for citizens displaced from homes near



the Lebanon border to return. Hezbollah has vowed to keep firing rockets into Israel until there is a cease-fire in Gaza.

Israel vowed retaliation for Iran's missile barrage, which it said had caused only a few injuries.

Israeli military spokesman Rear

Adm. Daniel Hagari said the coun-

try's air defenses intercepted many of the incoming missiles, though some landed in central and southern Israel.

"This strike will have consequences," he said. He said the attack had caused only "very few" injuries, but did not elaborate.

Israel and Iran have fought a shadow war for years, but rarely have they come into direct conflict.

Israel considers Iran to be its greatest foe -- citing Iran's repeated calls for Israel's destruction, its support for Arab militant groups and its nuclear program. Iran denies Israeli accusations that it is developing a nuclear weapon.

Moments before Iran launched its missiles, a shooting attack in Tel Aviv left six people dead, police said, adding that the two suspects who had opened fire on a boulevard in the Jaffa neighborhood had also been killed. The United States had warned

there would be severe consequences for Iran in the event of an attack on Israel. President Joe Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris monitored the attack on Israel from the White House Situation Room.

Iran launched another direct attack on Israel in April, but few of its proiectiles reached their targets. Many were shot down by a U.S.-led coalition, while others apparently failed at launch or crashed in flight. Iran said it fired the ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9
