rights but also hampers their physical and mental development. The officials encouraged community members to report child labour cases to the CHILDLINE helpline (1098) and collaborate in ensuring the safety and well-being of all children.

The local community is requested to follow the rules and regulations regarding child labour and support ongoing efforts to rehabilitate children rescued from such conditions. The authorities have assured that continuous monitoring and further rescue operations will be carried out across the district to curb this
