CAT quashes dismissal of four policemen

JAMMU: A Bench of Central Administrative Tribunal (CAT) Srinagar comprising M S Latif, Member (J), and Prasant Kumar, Member (A) quashed order of dismissal of four policemen namely Shaheel Ahmad Beigh, Altaf Ahmad Bhat, Muhammad Shafi Khatana and Shabir Ahluwa from service for their "dereliction" while manning a shrine at Pakharpora in central Kashmir's Budgam district in 2014.
 CAT held that tested on the touchstone of the law points discussed, it found that there was no material available with the disciplinary authority to arrive at a satisfaction that it was not reasonably practicable to hold enquiry which compelled dispensation with the formal enquiry in terms of Section 126 (2B) of J&K Constitution as it was then. "The penalty imposed upon the petitioners of having been dismissed from service, being contrary to law, and reasoning cannot be upheld. As a consequence, the impugned order bearing No 302 of 2014 dated June 11, 2014, is quashed and set aside," the court said.
 However, the court said that the authorities would be free to hold a regular enquiry against the constables strictly in accordance with the provisions of the law.
 "If the respondents (authorities) decide to hold the enquiry, the same shall be initiated and brought to its logical conclusion within a period of four months from the date of receipt of a copy of this order," the tribunal said.
 While the tribunal held that quashing the dismissal shall not entitle the policemen to claim salary during the period they were out of service, it said: "However, the respondents shall deal with this issue after the final report of the enquiry is received by them and shall decide the same in view of the conclusion drawn by the enquiry officer."
 Further, the tribunal said, its order would not have any effect upon the pendency or otherwise of any FIR pending against the petitioners before any investigating agency or any court of competent jurisdiction.

Compassionate appointment is provided purely on humanitarian ground, cannot be claimed as matter of right: CAT

JAMMU: A Judicial Member of Central Administrative Tribunal Srinagar DS Mehra held that the claim for appointment on compassionate ground is not a hereditary right or it cannot be claimed on the basis of a succession. The compassionate appointment is provided purely on humanitarian ground and cannot be claimed as a matter of right.
 This order has been passed in a petition filed by Sana Shafi whose father Md. Shafi Dar, a Junior Engineer in the Public Works Department, Kashmir, died in harness on February 18, 2011, during his active service. After the death of the father, the petitioner applied for appointment on compassionate ground under SRO 43 of 1994. The respondents considered the claim of the petitioner under the said SRO and offered an Orderly (class IV) post in the Public Works Department, R&B Division, Kashmir. The petitioner joined the said post on March 26, 2018.
 As on today, the petitioner is working with the respondent Department as Orderly. 2. The petitioner vide letter dated April 20, 2018 (Annexure-III) again requested the respondents to re-examine and reconsider her claim for appointment on compassionate ground on a higher post since she has already passed 12th class. When the respondents did not give any response to her request, the petitioner filed a writ petition bearing SWP no. 2438 of 2018 before the High Court of Jammu and Kashmir for reconsidering her request which was subsequently transferred to this Tribunal and numbered as T.A. No. 2313 of 2020.
 CAT after hearing both the sides observed that it clear that the claim for appointment on compassionate ground is not a hereditary right or it cannot be claimed on the basis of a succession. The compassionate appointment is provided purely on humanitarian ground and cannot be claimed as a matter of right. After the death of the father of the petitioner in 2011, the petitioner applied for appointment on compassionate ground, she was appointed and working as such as on today as Orderly.
 While dismissing the petition, CAT observed that in view of above legal position, the petitioner is not entitled for second consideration by the respondents for appointment on compassionate ground.
