AIBA prez writes to CJJ, seeks guidelines on decorum for judges

NEW DELHI: Former Supreme Court Bar Association (SCBA) president and senior lawyer Adish Aggarwala has written to Chief Justice of India DY Chandrachud seeking framing of guidelines on decorum for judges while interacting with lawyers during judicial proceedings.

Aggarwala, who is the

president of the All India Bar Association (AIBA), also proposed the creation of a "monitoring mechanism" by a committee headed by a retired judge of the Supreme Court judge.

In his letter to the CJJ on October 7, the bar leader referred to a recent incident involving a senior judge of a Madurai Bench of the Madras High Court

and senior advocate P Wilson during a virtual hearing.

He claimed the senior lawyer was highlighting a case of possible conflict of interest of one of the judges sitting on the bench.

The letter said the senior judge of the high court was "seen shouting and using inappropriate language during the virtual proceedings" towards a senior advocate P Wilson and the Advocate on Record.

"Despite the senior advocate's clear intent, which was to highlight a potential conflict of interest without seeking the recusal of the junior judge, the senior judge responded with aggression," claimed Aggarwala.

He further said the judge "berated" the advocates, even though Wilson clarified and politely explained his position. The senior lawyer, in an effort to ease the situation, even extended an apology.

"The bench, in its apparent anger, has gone so far as to record a statement alleging that the senior advocate made remarks demeaning the court, which in fact were never uttered. This misrepresentation has the potential to have long-reaching implications for the judiciary, as it sets a dangerous precedent," the letter read.

The court order suggested that Wilson sought recusal of "the junior judge" and, in doing so, allegedly disrespected the court, it added.

"However, the circulated video of the proceedings clearly shows that the senior advocate was merely fulfilling his duty as an officer of the court by highlighting a potential conflict of interest. At no point, did he request the recusal of the judge or make any demeaning comments towards the court. This incident not only misrepresents the actual proceedings but also undermines the integrity of judicial conduct,"

Aggarwala said.

The former SCBA president, therefore, requested "the establishment of clear guidelines on the decorum that judges must observe while interacting with advocates".

"These guidelines should emphasise the need for respectful communication and professional behaviour in courtrooms, ensuring that advocates are never publicly berated or disrespected," he said.

Delhi HC to hear Wednesday plea on allowing Wangchuk, others to hold protest at Jantar Mantar

NEW DELHI: The Delhi High Court will hear on Wednesday a plea that seeks to allow climate activist Sonam Wangchuk and others to hold a protest at Jantar Mantar or any other suitable location in the national capital.

It said the march had covered over 900 km in 30 days with the objective of raising awareness about the ecological and cultural degradation of Ladakh and the broader Himalayan region.

"The petitioner organisation intends to hold an awareness campaign and peaceful protest at Jantar Mantar or any other suitable location in Delhi from October 8 to 23," the plea stated.

The Sixth Schedule pertains to the administration of tribal areas in Assam, Meghalaya, Tripura, and Mizoram as "autonomous districts and autonomous regions".

The plea claimed the police have failed to provide any valid ground for rejecting the request for holding the protest.

"The proposed demonstration is a peaceful expression of dissent aimed at highlighting significant social issues by the petitioner organisation. The proposed 'anshan' is aimed at raising awareness about critical societal issues and communicating grievances to the authorities. By denying the permission, the respondent is effectively suppressing this fundamental right....," the plea said.

"The inclusion of Assamese language in the list will aid in preservation, documentation and digitisation of ancient texts and general employment opportunities for local scholars, he added.

Sharing other key decisions taken at the Cabinet meet, the CM said it has

approved the recommendations of the District Delimitation Commission on the proposed redrawing of gaon panchayats, anchalik panchayats, zilla parishad constituencies and proposed reorganisation of development blocks.

This delimitation will cover all districts except the Sixth Schedule areas of the state, he added.

A three generation criterion for SC/ST/Tea tribe/ Ex-Tea tribe/ Adivasi/ Gorkha communities has been relaxed. Similar relaxation on three-generation domicile requirement will be given to applicants having Refuge Certificate of a date prior to March 25, 1971.

The Chief Minister said government land will be allocated to "non-governmental institutions of public nature" in three categories - educational, religious, and socio-cultural institutions.

To qualify, these institutions must have had possession for three years or more in rural areas and ten years or more in urban areas as of October 1, 2021.

The plea mentioned in an urgent hearing on Tuesday before a bench of Chief Justice Manmohan and Justice Tushar Rao Gedela but the bench listed it on Wednesday.

"Ladakhi activist Sonam Wangchuk is housed in Delhi along with 200 padyatris. Kindly list the petition for today post lunch," the counsel, representing petitioner Apex Body Leh, submitted.

Wangchuk and his associates from Ladakh were allegedly detained at the Delhi border by the local police on September 30 when

they were marching towards the national capital to demand the inclusion of Ladakh under the Sixth Schedule of the Constitution. They were, however, released later.

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This delimitation will cover all districts except the Sixth Schedule areas of the state, he added.

There are 219 development blocks in the state, out of which 181 are under general areas and 38 under Sixth Scheduled Areas. The total number of blocks will remain the same after reorganisation, the CM said.

Total number of zilla parishad constituencies will be 397 in place of the existing 420, he added.

Among other services to be provided under Mission Basundhara 3.0 is settlement of former Bhloodan/Gramdan land, granting ownership rights to occupancy tenants on town lands that were previously rural, providing reclassification options, and allowing limited

conversion of tea grant land to periodic patta, Sarma said.

Launch of two other services alongside Mission Basundhara 3.0 - digital repository for non-registrable/ optional registrable land and publishing 304 draft maps for reconstruction of damaged/ missing maps of Dibrugarh and Tinsukia districts for public viewing - have also been approved by the Cabinet.

"The Cabinet has also approved a liberalised settlement premium of Rs 5,000 per bigha for coffee and rubber plantation land," the CM added.

The Council of Ministers gave its nod to improving and strengthening of 108 rural roads and construction of 126 secondary schools, improving rural connectivity in 26 districts and developing secondary schools across 35 districts.

Indian regulators have done world-class job; made system more transparent: FM

MUMBAI: Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday commended Indian financial sector regulators for doing a "world-class job" and bringing greater transparency into the system.

Underlining that she is not against questioning or critiquing regulators, Sitharaman said there is a need to be "extremely conscious" about contributions made by them as well.

Speaking at the Financial Express Best Banks Awards here, the finance minister asked everybody to look at the emerging facts that are coming out in the Sebi matter, where the regulator's chairperson Madhabi Puri Buch has been accused of impropriety.

She said the regulators are being "looked up" by their peers in the world for improvements that they have got, including in markets, banks and insurance sectors.

"Indian regulators, and the way in which they are functioning, have actually brought greater transparency to the system," the minister said, seeking to de-link the comments from the Sebi matter.

She also said that the government was not acting under any pressure as the BJP won less number of seats in the Lok Sabha elections.

The pace of decision-making remains the same, the minister said, pointing out decisions on initiatives involving Rs 15 lakh crore taken by the new Cabinet since the current government came to power in June this year.

She said that in some cases committed expenditure is going up to 80 per cent, whereas the development needs are being overlooked.

The minister said that spending by the state governments on political prom-

ises should be based on the fiscal capacity of the concerned state.

Making it clear that she was not against welfare measures, Sitharaman said, "We cannot deny help to the poor for moving out of poverty".

On the rollback of the lateral entry scheme of officials, she said it was not because of "coalition compulsions" but to improve upon the idea.

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Haryana win reinvigorates BJP, deals blow to Congress' hopes

NEW DELHI: Against the dominant narrative of a Congress comeback, the BJP has pulled off a historic third term on the trot in Haryana, a feat that will reinvigorate the ruling party cadres and could deal a debilitating blow to the Congress looking for further ascendancy after its improved show in the Lok Sabha polls.

A stunning victory in Haryana coupled with its best-ever show in Jammu and Kashmir is bound to blunt detractors' claim that the BJP's grip was loosening over its supporters and brings into sharp focus its organisational efficiency and its leadership's keen ability to redraw strategy in line with the changing ground dynamics.

As the party prepares to fight other

Maharashtra and Jharkhand in a few weeks, this win will provide it much-needed momentum. It will bolster its hopes of another come-from-behind victory, more so in the western state as the opposition INDIA bloc had inflicted a big defeat on the BJP-led alliance in the Lok Sabha elections.

It was also an election in which the BJP worked in cohesion with its ideological mentor Rashtriya Swayamsevak Sangh (RSS), whose functionaries have been keenly involved in the party's strategy sessions across states following suggestions of some drift in their ties during the parliamentary elections.

Often seen to be on the defensive when it has to battle local issues and caste factor, BJP leaders noted that the party successfully turned the tables on the Congress in Haryana by projecting the polls as a contest

between "parehi and kharehi" government led by Bhupinder Singh Hooda between 2004-14 and its "clean" administration since 2014.

"One of our successes was that we succeeded in changing the poll narrative of the Lok Sabha polls," a BJP leader not willing to be named said.

With Hooda's influence dominant in the state Congress and the party's other satraps like Kumari Selja pushed to the background, the BJP upped its ground game as its leaders, including poll in-charge and Union minister Dharmendra Pradhan, held meetings with various communities and successfully tapped in the state's traditional faultline of Jat versus non-Jat politics.

The resentment of vocal Jats and a section of Dalits with the BJP dominated the narrative but the results demonstrated that the relatively

mutated majority of Other Backward Classes and poorer sections of Dalits besides the "upper castes" rallied behind the ruling party.

The party's decision to replace Manohar Lal Khattar with an OBC chief minister and more affable Nayab Singh Saini also seems to have paid off. BJP leaders involved in the polls said they successfully won back a section of Dalits who had voted against the party in the Lok Sabha polls.

Though Modi's public campaign was relatively sedate as he held merely four rallies, he drew the battle lines with a focus on corruption, nepotism and casteism under the Congress, highlighting the controversial land deals involving the "damaad" (Robert Vadra) during the Congress's rule and the politics of "bapu-bete", a swipe at Hooda and his MP son

Depender Singh Hooda.

With the party defying all predictions to repulse the challenge from a resurgent Congress, another BJP leader said their win will lay to rest "all the chatter" about the party's falling political stock following its below-par Lok Sabha election performance.

The Election Commission projected that the BJP had either won or was leading in 49 seats in the 90-member assembly. If the tally holds fast, it will be its best-ever performance in the state.

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
