**J&K BJP leaders slam CM's threats, urge focus on development & governance**

JAMMU: In a sharp response to Jammu and Kashmir's former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah's recent remarks about the Government of India, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leaders have strongly criticized his statements. Arun Gupta, spokesperson for the J&K BJP, along with Dr. Tahir Chowdhary and Zoravar Singh Jamwal, launched a scathing attack on Omar Abdullah's threats and allegations. They accused him of trying to mislead the public and undermine the region's stability for political gain. Gupta began the press conference by questioning Omar Abdullah's role and authority in making such alarming statements. Abdullah had warned the Government of India that the situation in Jammu and Kashmir could deteriorate rapidly, adding that they were test-

ing the patience of the region. He also warned that if the situation worsened, it would not take long to trigger violence, emphasizing that he did not wish for bloodshed but could not guarantee peace under the current circumstances. Gupta condemned these statements, stating, "Who are you to threaten the Government of India? Are you the Chief Minister of a state or the head of an organization making threats?" He went on to criticize Abdullah for attempting to

manipulate the situation and said that the people of Jammu and Kashmir did not need to be threatened but needed effective governance and development. Gupta highlighted the fact that Jammu and Kashmir had seen significant development in the past few years. "The state's economy had improved, tourism had flourished, and the people were benefiting from better infrastructure and services. He asked, "Does the common man in Jammu and Kashmir care about statehood? They

care about whether their families are prospering, whether they have jobs, and whether their children have access to quality education." Dr. Tahir Chowdhary added that despite Omar Abdullah's commitment to not contest elections until Jammu and Kashmir regained its statehood, he went ahead and formed a government. He criticized Abdullah and the People's Democratic Party (PDP) for playing politics with statehood while ignoring the needs of the people. Dr. Chowdhary emphasized that the common people were happier than ever due to the progress made by the government, which included the improvement of infrastructure, healthcare, and education in the region. Chowdhary said, "If you can't handle the job, step aside, and let others who are willing to work for the people take over." Zoravar Singh Jamwal further

called out Abdullah and the National Conference (NC) for their failure to address the region's issues during their time in power. He noted, "These parties are uncomfortable with the progress Jammu and Kashmir is making. They cannot accept that the common Kashmiri is doing well, whether they are fruit sellers, auto rickshaw drivers, or small business owners." BJP leaders made it clear that they would not allow the region to revert to the instability and violence it witnessed in the past. They firmly rejected Abdullah's warnings and reaffirmed their commitment to maintaining peace and furthering the development of Jammu and Kashmir. Gupta stated that the Government of India had made significant efforts to restore peace, and no amount of threats from Abdullah or anyone else would derail the progress.

**Teacher suspended over misconduct with female student**

RAJOURI: A teacher of a government school was suspended for alleged misconduct with a female student in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district on Tuesday, officials said. Students resorted to protests against the teacher for his misbehaviour with a female student, prompting senior officials to rush to the Government Higher Secondary School at Kakora in the district. "I came here after hearing about the incident that there were allegations of misconduct by a teacher with a girl student, triggering protests from students," Tehsildar Manjakote Jazia Qazmi told reporters. The teacher has been suspended and the procedure for registering a case against him under the relevant sections is on, she said. An order was issued by the chief education officer (CEO), Rajouri, directing the suspension of the teacher. "In exercise of the powers vested in the undersigned, Ajaz Ahmed, Teacher, is hereby placed under suspension with immediate effect under the provisions of the Jammu and Kashmir Government Employees (Conduct) Rules," the order said. During the period of suspension, the said official shall remain attached to the office of the zonal education officer; Klnwas, and shall be entitled to subsistence allowance as admissible under rules, along with being governed by all other provisions applicable to suspended government employees, it added. According to the order, a communication was received from the principal of the school, reporting that serious allegations of misbehaviour with a girl student had been levelled against teacher Ajaz Ahmed. "The allegations are of a grave nature, directly affecting the conduct, integrity and reputation of a government servant, and warrant immediate administrative action to ensure a free, fair and impartial enquiry, as well as to safeguard the interests of the institution and the student community," it said. In view of the seriousness of the charges and the need to prevent the delinquent official from influencing the enquiry process or tampering with witnesses, it has become imperative to place him under suspension pending enquiry."

**After 24 years, Court discharges accused in Jammu Fake Passport Scam**

JAMMU: In a significant order, the Court of Principal Sessions Judge, Jammu, presided over by Y.P. Bourne, has discharged

Ravi Chandran alias Ravi, son of Shrinawas in a long-pending fake passport and fake stamp case registered in 2001. The case (FIR No. 4/2001 of Police Station

JIC Jammu) was filed under Sections 420, 466, 473, 120-B RPC and Section 12 of the Passport Act against several accused, including Farooq Ahmed

Sheikh, Habib Ullah Malik, Gh. Ahmad Mir, Mohd. Ayub Haji, and Ravi Chandran. According to the prosecution, the accused were alleged to have prepared fake rubber stamps bearing the inscriptions "Govt. of India" and "Bharat Sarkar" for use in forging passports by replacing the photographs of genuine holders with those of

the accused. However, during the proceedings, the Court found no direct evidence linking Ravi Chandran to the alleged preparation of fake stamps. While a few witnesses mentioned accompanying accused Mohd. Ayub to his shop, none stated that Ravi Chandran was directly involved in the act. Furthermore, the

Investigating Officer failed to verify with the Passport Office whether the disputed stamps were actually fake. Taking note of the fact that the other co-accused had already been acquitted after a full-fledged trial, the Court ruled that no prima facie case was made out against Ravi Chandran. Accordingly, he was discharged from all charges.

**Labour Commissioner engages stakeholders, distributes welfare cheques to workers**

**HC dismisses appeal against negative marking in JKPSC Exam**

JAMMU: The High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh at Jammu has dismissed an appeal challenging the introduction of negative marking in the JKPSC preliminary examination, holding that the provision was already part of the governing rules and duly notified before the test. The appeal was filed by Antriksh Sharma against the order of the Writ Court dated September 17, 2025, which had rejected his petition seeking quashment of JKPSC Notice No. PSC/DR/LAW/2025 dated

September 10, 2025. The petitioner had argued that introducing negative marking after commencement of the selection process amounted to changing rules mid-way, and that modifications in the syllabus adversely impacted candidates. However, the Division Bench of Justice Rajesh Oswal and Justice Rajesh Sekhri observed that the Jammu and Kashmir Public Service Commission (Conduct of Examination) Rules, 2022, already mandated negative marking for incorrect answers. The notification dated September 10, 2025,

was issued prior to the exam held on September 28, 2025, leaving no scope for grievance. The Court also noted that changes in the syllabus were necessitated by the repeal of laws following the Reorganisation Act, 2019, and hence could not be faulted. Since the appellant had already participated in the examination, his challenge was found to be misconceived. Dismissing the appeal, the Court upheld the earlier decision of the Writ Court, concluding that no indulgence was warranted.
