NC names 3 nominees for Rajya Sabha elections

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir National Conference (JKNC) on Friday officially announced its nominees for three of the four Rajya Sabha seats due for election, while confirming ongoing discussions over the remaining one seat.

The elections, scheduled for October 24, will fill four seats from Jammu and Kashmir that have remained vacant since 2021.

NC General Secretary Ali Muhammad Sagar named the three candidates as

Choudhary Muhammad Ramzan, Shammi Oberoi, and Sajad Kichloo.

Speaking at a press conference, Sagar said the party is effectively contesting three seats independently, confident of success based on the NC-led alliance's strength in the 90-member Legislative Assembly.

Analysts note that the contest for the fourth seat is expected to be competitive. as the alliance collectively commands 24 votes for the seat, while the

WASHINGTON: President Donald Trump was passed over for the Nobel Peace Prize on Friday despite jockeying from his fellow Republicans, various world leaders and - most vocally himself.

Opposition activist María Machado Corina Venezuela was awarded the prize. The Norwegian Nobel Committee said it was honouring her "for her tireless work promoting democratic rights for the people of Venezuela and for her strug-

gle to achieve a just and peaceful transition from dic-

tatorship to democracy." Trump, who has long coveted the prestigious prize, has been outspoken about his desire for the honour during both of his presidential terms, particularly lately as

he takes credit for ending

conflicts around the world.

He has expressed doubts

that the Nobel committee

would ever grant him the award. "They'll have to do what
