This year's theme, "From Head to Toe - Take Control", emphasizes holistic awareness and timely intervention in thrombotic conditions.

Emphasizing the significance of World Thrombosis Day, he stated: "We must keep our eyes open to thrombosis, a silent killer. 1 in 4 people globally die due to thrombotic conditions. Early detection and timely intervention are vital to saving lives." Dr. Kohli further stressed the importance of ewer oral anticoagulants, advanced diagnostic tools, and mechanical thrombectomy systems like AngioJet, which offer efficient clot removal and better patient outcomes when used judiciously.

He also thanked Rohan and Abhishek from Bayer for their support in facilitating this academic event.
