### Fire Safety Advisory

Issued by the Assistant Director Fire & Emergency Services, Command Kishtwar With the advent of winter, the use of heating appliances and traditional heating systems increases considerably across the Union Territory. In view of the heightened fire risk during this period, the general public is hereby advised to adopt the following precautionary measures to prevent fire incidents and ensure safety of life and property.

**Building and Electrical Safety** 

All fire preventive and protective recommendations issued by the Department during inspections and audits shall be strictly Implemented.

Avoid the use of defective substandard, or high-wattage electrical appliances, such as heaters and blanket particularly in old buildings where wiring systems may be worn out.

Only ISI-certified electrical equipment and appliances shall be used.

Ensure the use of good quality fuses, Miniature Circuit Breakers (MCB) and Earth Leakage Circuit Breakers (ELCB) of appropriate rating.

Prevent overloading of electrical circuits; use one socket for one appliance only. Replace all damaged plugs, switches, and cables without delay

Keep electrical wires away from wet, hot, or flammable surfaces and never conceal them under carpets or mats.

Switch off appliances after use and disconnect the main supply before leaving the premises for extended periods.

Heating and LPG Safety

Ensure adequate ventilation when operating gas or LPG heaters Remove LPG cylinders from living rooms before going to sleep Avoid simultaneous use of multiple electrical heating devices such as electric blankets and

Exercise extreme caution while using traditional heating systems such as Hamams or wood-fired setup monitor temperature before adding fuel. Inspect all heating systems and chimneys prior to winter use to ensure safe operation.

Never leave cooking activities unattended

Remain in the kitchen while frying, boiling, or grilling food. Keep flammable materials such as towels, mitts, packaging, or curtains away from the

In case of a pan fire, smother the flames by covering the utensil with a lid and turning off the burner. Do not pour water on burning all or grease.

For oven fires, switch off the heat and keep the oven door closed until the fire extinguishers

General Fire Precautions

Handle kangris (traditional fire pots) and candles with utmost care, place them only on nonflammable and stable surface

Store and handle charcoal and other combustible materials safely and away from heat

Ensure proper maintenance and ventilation of inverter batteries and electrical installat Keep escape routes clear and ensure fire extinguishers, if available, are in working condition In the event of a fire, immediately contact the nearest Fire & Emergency Services Control Room Kishtwar by Dialing 101, 01995-259331
