In addition, the Division has achieved a complete transition to energy efficient LED lighting with more than 1,48,700 LED fixtures installed across stations, offices and service areas. This initiative has significantly reduced power

consumption and maintenance costs. To enhance passengers convenience with maintaining energy efficiency, 10 natural water coolers have been installed at major stations including Dadar, Bandra Terminus, Borivali, Bhayandar, Surat, Udhna, Nandurbar and Vapi. These coolers work without compressors and have a cooling capacity of 45 litres per hour and store up to 150 litres, maintaining a temperature between 23°C and 27°C while using minimal energy.

Additionally, across Mumbai Central Division more than 1,200 occupancy sensors have been installed to optimize the air-conditioning systems more efficiently. These smart sensors detect human presence and automatically adjust the airconditioning, reducing unnecessary energy usage in empty rooms.

Quantum-secure virtual tourism innovation granted utility patent

JAMMU: A groundbreaking innovation in digital security and virtual experiences has been recognized with the grant of a utility patent titled "A System for Identity Providing Secure Authentication on Virtual Tourism Platforms and A Method of Secure Authentication Thereof' (Patent No. 572210) on 16-10-2025. This pioneering technology has been developed by Prof. (Dr.) Sat Prakash Bansal, Prof. (Dr.) Suman Sharma, Dr. Parveen Sadotra, Mohd Yaseen Kichloo (IPS), and Rabia Koser. The patent integrates quantum cryptography, AI-driven behavior monitoring, and immersive AR/VR technologies to provide secure, seamless access to virtual tourism environments. As interest in metaverse platforms and remote cultural engagement grows, concerns regarding cyber threats and data privacy-particularly in the era of quantum computing-have become more pronounced. This innovation addresses these challenges by deploying quantum key distribution (QKD), zeroknowledge proof authentication, and a digital passport system, ensuring users' identities remain protected against both current and future cyber threats.

Key features of the system include quantum-resistant encryption, real-time identity verification to prevent impersonation and replay attacks, secure integration with AR/VR platforms, and a privacy-first design ensuring user data confidentiality through multi-tier authentication. While primarily designed for virtual tourism, the system's scalable architecture allows potential application across digital finance, healthcare, education, and e-commerce within the metaverse. Experts suggest that this patent could become a foundational standard for secure digital identity in virtual environments. Looking ahead, the technology is expected to see early adoption in virtual tourism by 2027, with potential expansion into government digital ID programs and cross-border virtual services by 2030.
