KATHUA: Justice Rajnesh Oswal, Judge of the High Court of Jammu & Kashmir Ladakh and Administrative Judge for District Kathua on Saturday and reviewed progress of the judicial infrastructure projects coming up in the District.

work at Billawar, Basohli, Mahanpur and the new District Court Complex.

Special emphasis was laid on the timely completion of the Lawvers' Chambers block. The Administrative Judge directed the functionaries of Executing Agencies to expedite the works to ensure early completion of the same.

Deputy Commissioner Kathua Rajesh Sharma and Senior Superintendent of Police Mohita Sharma also met Justice Oswal during his

Purmandal-Uttarvahini Tirth Sewa Nyas submits development proposals to LG; special emphasis on heritage restoration, development

Uttarvahini Tirth Sewa Nvas, led by President Satish Gupta and Maheshwar Sharma along Executive Members Jatinder Goswami, Satish Bharti, and Vikas Baru, was held with the Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha to discuss major religious, cultural and developmental proposals for the sacred site of Purmandal (also known as Chhota

Kashi) on the banks of the Devika River. A key focus of the discussion was the ring road connectivity-the Nyas proposed that Purmandal be included within the alignment of the upcoming Ring Road, citing that the current route bypasses the area via Raya Morh, thereby limiting regional access and mobility for visiting pilgrims. Integrating Purmandal would not only bolster connectivity but would enhance accessibility to this historic



pilgrimage destination. Another important propos-

al involved the creation of a dedicated Ved Vidhyalaya

(Vedic Purmandal, aimed at pre-

serving Sanatan culture and Vedic traditions and imparting sacred knowledge and values to future generations. The Nyas urged allocation of land and resources for building a grand structure to house the institution.

Heritage restoration also featured prominently: the Nyas emphasized the need to restore ancient havelis and temples in Purmandal to their original architectural forms, thereby rejuvenating the site's historical religious legacy and boosting cultural tourism. The meeting further covered the preservation and beautification of the Devika River-a comprehensive plan was presented that includes regular cleaning of the river, the construction of check dams at suitable locations to control flooding, and active collaboration with departments such as Flood Control, Geology & Mining, and Social Forestry to mount a coordinated campaign for the river's upkeep. Finally,

the Nyas proposed the construction of a "Devika Yatri Bhawan". The proposal stressed early identification of suitable land and swift commencement of construction to address the growing

needs of pilgrimage tourism. In closing, the Nyas formally invited the LG to visit Purmandal on the auspicious occasion Margashirsha Chaturdashithe manifestation day of Devika Maiya-on November 2025.
