# Iyer, Arya tons power India A to 171-run rout of Australia A

KANPUR: Centuries from Shrevas Iver and Privansh Arya powered India A to a commanding 171-run victory over Australia A in the first unofficial ODI held in Kanpur on Wednesday, October 1. The match had originally been scheduled for Tuesday but was rescheduled due to rain. Once play resumed, India A made the most of their opportunity, posting a mammoth total of 413/6 before bowling out the visitors for just 242.

India A's top order fired on all cylinders, with every one of the top five batters registering a half-century or more. Openers Priyansh Arya and Prabhsimran Singh, both of whom play for Punjab Kings in the IPL, gave the hosts a flying start with a 135-run opening stand. Prabhsimran was the

first to fall, scoring 56, but Arya continued to dominate, bringing up a superb century that included five sixes. His innings ended on 101, courtesy of leg-spinner Tanveer Sangha.

The momentum continued as Arya's IPL captain, Shreyas Iyer, joined him at the crease and found another capable partner in Riyan Parag after Arya's dismissal. The duo tore into the Australian bowling, adding 132 runs in just 15 overs. peppered with nine sixes. Parag eventually fell for a brisk 67, but the punishment didn't stop there. Ayush Badoni stepped in and slammed a 27-ball fifty in the death overs, helping India A breach the 400-run mark.

Chasing a daunting target of 414, Australia A got off to a bright start, with Jake

Fraser-McGurk smashing five boundaries early to race to 23. However, his quick cameo was cut short, and while Cooper Connolly and opener Mackenzie Harvey tried to steady the innings, India A kept applying pressure. Harvey looked in good touch, reaching his fifty, and wicketkeeper Lachlan Shaw also got a start. At 169/2 after 20 overs, Australia A appeared to be in the contest. The game, however, took a dramatic turn when left-arm spinner Nishant Sindhu broke the partnership by dismissing Harvey. That breakthrough opened the floodgates. Ravi Bishnoi picked up two quick wickets, and Sindhu continued to run through the middle order. In a span of just 12 runs, Australia A collapsed from 169/2 to 181/7, losing five wickets in no time
