SAMBA: Continuing its drive against drug smugglers & ped-

During checking, 10 grams approximately heroin like substance was recovered from the possession of the rider.

The drug peddler identified as Nazir Ahmed S/o Moju Din R/o Rakh Barotian, Tehsil Vijaypur, Samba has been arrested. The contraband item and the vehicle have also been seized.

A case FIR No 74/2025 u/s 8/21/22/25 NDPS Act has been registered at PS Rangarh and investigation started.

Theft case solved, accused arrested, stolen cash recovered

UDHAMPUR: On 27th September 2025, Police Station Rehambal registered an FIR No. 150/2025 U/S 305(d), 331(4) BNS on the complaint of Sunil Sharma (Pujari) S/o Munshi Ram, R/o Sunari, Hartaryan, regarding theft in Kalka Mata Mandir, Barshani by some unknown persons.

During the course of investigation, swift action was taken by Udhampur Police and one accused person namely Mohd Aslam S/o Beer Mohd R/o Basti Garah, Hiranagar, Kathua was arrested.

On sustained questioning, the accused disclosed that he along with his associate Showkat Ali S/o Mohd Iqbal R/o Pul Doda, Gadsa, Doda committed the theft at Kalka Mata Mandir, Barshani during the intervening night of 27th September 2025. On his disclosure, the stolen cash has been recovered. The second accused is still at large and efforts are on to nab him.

Inter-State drug peddler arrested at Chenani; poppy straw recovered

UDHAMPUR: Continuing its drive against narco-smuggling, Udhampur Police recovered contraband poppy straw at Naka Point, Motor Shed NHW Chenani.

During routine traffic/naka checking, a white-colored Honda Amaze taxi bearing registration No. UP65FT-6902 was stopped by the police team of PS Chenani, led by its SHO. On checking the passengers and their luggage, a sky-blue suitcase and a dark-blue bag belonging to passenger Kuldeep Singh S/o Surjit Singh, R/o Lattianwal, District Kapurthala, Punjab were found in the vehicle's trunk.

Upon thorough checking, both bags were discovered to contain contraband poppy straw, weighing a total of 19.79 kg.

In this connection, Case FIR No. 95/2025 under Sections 8/15 of the NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Chenani, and investigation is underway.

Bovine smuggling attempt foiled, 20 bovines rescued, vehicle seized

UDHAMPUR: Police team of PS Rehambal led by its SHO, while performing routine naka checking, received information through reliable sources regarding a tanker (JK03B/8711) loaded with bovine animals in a cruel manner, coming from Jammu side towards Udhampur without any valid permission. Acting on this information, the police intercepted the tanker at Garnai.

During checking, 20 bovine animals were found being transported illegally and were rescued safely. The vehicle was seized. The driver of the vehicle fled from the spot taking advantage of heavy traffic on the road.

In this regard, a Case FIR No. 152/2025 U/S 223 BNS & 11 PCA Act stands registered at PS Rehambal.

Udhampur Police's crackdown on bovine smuggling: 978 bovines rescued, 165 smugglers arrested, 8 booked under PSA

UDHAMPUR: District Police Udhampur continues its relentless crackdown on bovine smuggling with decisive enforcement actions taken during the months of January to September 2025.

A total of 145 cases were registered, resulting in the rescue of 978 bovines from illegal transportation. 173 persons were

arrested in connection with these cases, including 165 under bovine smuggling offences and 08 under the Public Safety Act (PSA). Moreover, 104 vehicles used for transportation of bovines were seized and 20 registration certificates of such vehicles were cancelled. 67 convictions were secured during this period, demonstrating the district police's strong legal follow-through. Additionally, property attachment proceedings were initiated in 05 cases, 01 Tata Mobile (forfeiture), 02 Mahindra Bolero pickup trucks, and 01 Tata Yodha, with an estimated total value of Rs 51 lakh.

Police conducts inspection of SIM vendors to curb SIM misuse

HANDWARA: As part of its sustained efforts to strengthen internal security and prevent the misuse of mobile communication facilities, J&K Police launched a special district-wide inspection of SIM card vendors across Police District Handwara.

Police teams carried out checks at multiple locations, focusing on Verification of Know Your Customer (KYC) compliance, Scrutiny of documentation during SIM issuance, ensuring no SIM is activated without valid ID/address verification, reviewing safeguards adopted by vendors against unauthorized issuance.

While interacting with vendors, police officials highlighted their vital role in protecting communication networks from misuse in unlawful activities. Vendors were strictly directed to follow KYC protocols and warned of stringent legal action, including license cancellation and prosecution, in case of negligence. J&K Police also urged the public to stay vigilant and promptly report any suspicious activity, fake documents, or irregularities related to SIM cards. Officials emphasized that community cooperation along with strict enforcement is essential to prevent misuse and ensure district security.

Reaffirming its zero-tolerance policy, J&K Police assured that such inspection drives will continue regularly to maintain a safe and secure communication environment.

3 drug peddlers arrested; substantial quantity of contraband seized

KULGAM: In ongoing crackdown against the menace of drugs, J&K Police in Kulgam arrested 03 drug peddlers and recovered Substantial quantity of contraband substances from their possession.

A special police party led by Incharge Police Post Mirbazar, under the close supervision of Addl. SP NHW Qazigund Kulgam, was conducting routine patrolling at Baghi Sakloo, Mirbazar. During checking, a police party intercepted & apprehended 03 suspicious individuals. On their personal search, police recovered 80 grams of charas and 2.7 kilograms of wet cannabis leaves from their possession.

They have been identified as Zahid Bashir Bhat, son of Bashir Ahmad Bhat, resident of Bonpora Nambal, Anantnag, Aidal Ahmad Wani, son of Mohd Iqbal Wani, resident of Khandaypora Kragsoo, Anantnag & Razwan Ahmad Itoo, son of Nazir Ahmad Itoo, resident of Hangalpahlo, Pahalgam, Anantnag.

Accordingly, a case vide FIR No. 201/2025 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Qazigund and investigation has been initiated.
