# Mission YUVA: CS directs time bound loan disbursement, capacity enhancement of entrepreneurs

SRINAGAR: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo, on Thursday chaired a high-level meeting to review the progress and implementation of Mission YUVA, taking a detailed appraisal of achievements made so far and charting the future course of action with concerned departments and stakeholders.

The meeting was attended by Additional Chief Secretaries of Higher Education, Planning, and Agriculture Production Departments; Principal Secretary, Finance: Commissioner Secretary, Industries & Secretaries of Employment and Rural Development Departments; Director Employment; Director, Handicrafts (Kashmir). besides other senior officers.

Vice-Chancellors Universities. Managing Director, J&K Bank, and Deputy Commissioners participated through video conferencing. While reviewing the progress under Mission YUVA, the Chief Secretary directed the Employment Department and J&K Bank to adopt proactive measures to meet the tar-

gets set for the current financial year. He emphasized that loans worth Rs 1,000 crore must be disbursed to facilitate grounding of projects worth Rs 2,000 crore, thereby enabling aspiring entrepreneurs to establish viable business ventures. He underscored the need for enhancing the capacity of beneficiaries to transform their ventures into successful enterprises and called for convergence of all employment generation initiatives such as Lakhpati Didis under JKRLM, PMEGP, HADP, JKCIP, and PMFME with Mission YUVA to maximize their collective impact.

Highlighting the significance of grassroots-level support systems, Dulloo directed that the Single Block Development (SBDUs), Block Handholding Desks (BHDs), and YUVA Doots under the Mission be optimally utilized to facilitate on-ground execution and synergy with other government schemes

He further instructed banks to depute their representatives to the BHDs at block level to streamline the process of approvals and ensure timely sanction and disbursal of loans. Deputy Commissioners were asked to closely monitor the establishment of enterprises by beneficiaries and expedite processes from District Level Implementation Committee (DLIC) approvals to bank sanctions and loan disbursals. The Chief Secretary also urged districts to complete the recruitment of required manpower for smooth functioning of Mission YUVA structures.

To ensure wider outreach, the Chief Secretary called for involving legislators, public figures, and local influencers in awareness campaigns. He advised strategizing engagement with focus groups such as Didis, Lakhpati PMVishwakarma beneficiaries, PMKVY trainees, and artisans from the handicraft sector. encouraging their participation under Mission YUVA.

#### HC quashes detention order issued by DM Doda **STATE TIMES NEWS** Authority which would envisaged by Article 22(5) of

JAMMU: In a significant judgment, Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul of High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh at Jammu has quashed the Preventive Detention of a close aide of MLA Mehraj Malik namely Mohammad Rafi alias Pinka, son of Ghulam Kadir Sheikh resident of Phagsoo (Thathri), District Doda who had been detained under J&K Public Safety Act, 1978 vide Order No.PSA 03 of 2025 dated 10-04-2025 passed by the District Magistrate, Doda. After hearing Advocate Rahul Raina appearing for the detenue Mohd. Rafi alias Pinka and Govt. Advocate Eishaan Dadhichi appearing for District Magistrate, Doda and others, Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul observed that, 'Advocate Rahul Raina has contended that subjective satisfaction is to arrive at by Detaining reflect application of mind

on its part. He further submitted that the allegations mentioned in Grounds of Detention are vague, absurd and baseless and without any substance and also relied upon a judgment of Division Bench of this court dated 26-07-2024 in LPA No. 19/2024 titled Showkat Ali V/s UT of J&K.' Advocate Rahul Raina further submitted that Grounds of Detention are bereft of details of activities of Detenue which would have necessitated issuance of Detention Order in as much as issuance of Order of Detention on vague grounds deprives detenue of his right to make an effective and meaningful representation against Order of Detention and if the detention order is passed on vague grounds, then Constitutional right of making representation

against detention order as

the Constitution of India would become mirage and that issuance of Order of Detention on vague grounds would amount to be an arbitrary exercise of power by detaining authority. In support of his arguments, Advocate Rahul Raina relied upon Jahangir Khan Fazal Khan Pathan V/s Police Commissioner, Ahmadabad and Anr. (1989) 3 SCC 590 and Krishan Lal alias Lundi

Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul after considering the submissions of Advocate Rahul Raina observed that in the present case the Detention Order was passed on April 10, 2025 and approved by the Home Department vide Govt. Order dated April 16, 2025 and after approval, the District Magistrate, Doda has considered and rejected the representation vide order

dated May 1, 2025 though

being forwarded to the Advisorv Board. The Advisory Board has not considered and decided the representation nor has any decision been conveyed to the detenue. In this regard the court

relied upon several judgments that the representation in such cases must be considered expeditiously. After hearing both the sides and adverting to the rival contentions, Justice

Vinod Chatterji Koul allowed the Habeas Corpus Petition (HCP) of Detenue, who is a close aide of MLA Mehraj Malik and accordingly quashed Detention Order No. PSA 03 of 2025 dated April 10, 2025 passed by the District Magistrate, Doda and further issued directions that detenue Mohd.Rafi alias Pinka be released from the custody forthwith, if he is not otherwise required in any other case.
