SRINAGAR: The sustained excellence and unflappable composure consistently demonstrated by Jammu & Kashmir's fast bowlers stands as convincing evidence of the region's burgeoning arsenal of pac-

ers. These talented bowlers not only generate impressive speed but also extract sharp bounce from any surface, displaying the rare ability to move the ball both ways off the seam and through the air-a testament to their skill and versatility.

Electing to bowl first on a seamer-friendly surface, Jammu and Kashmir unleashed a quartet of fast bowlers who decimated Rajasthan's batting lineup, bundling them out for a modest 152 in the first innings of their Ranji Trophy encounter at the Sher-e-Kashmir Cricket Stadium today. The pace trio of Auqib Nabi, Yudhvir Singh, and Sunil Kumar ran riot from the outset, exploiting the conditions brilliantly and leaving the visitors struggling to find any rhythm at the crease.

Rajasthan, put into bat, failed to withstand J&K's relentless pace attack. Mahipal Lomror showed resilience with a composed 37 off 76 balls, while Kartik Sharma (32) and Deepak Chahar

(23) offered brief resistance. Apart from them, the batting order crumbled quickly as Sunil Kumar claimed four wickets for 32 runs, Augib Nabi picked up three for 29, and Yudhvir Singh chipped in with two crucial scalps.

In response to Rajasthan's first-innings total, Jammu & Kashmir reached 66 for 2 in 24 overs at stumps on the opening day. The dependable Shubham Khajuria anchored the innings with an unbeaten 16 off 60 deliveries, displaying patience and composure on a challenging track. At the other end, the resilient skipper Paras Dogra held firm on 19 not out, guiding his side safely to the close of play.

Earlier, Qamran Iqbal (24) and Yawar Hassan (1) were the two wickets to fall, both dismissed after promising starts. For Rajasthan, Deepak Chahar and A.V. Choudhary shared the spoils with a wicket apiece, maintaining a disciplined bowling effort throughout the session.

Jammu & Kashmir still trail by 86 runs with eight wickets in hand, and the second day's play promises intriguing battles ahead as the hosts look to build a strong foundation against a probing Rajasthan attack.
