SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir's cricket team delivered an awe-inspiring performance, powered by a sensational bowling display from Auqib Nabi, to secure a commanding innings victory over Rajasthan in the Ranji Trophy Elite Group-A encounter at the iconic Sher-e-Kashmir Cricket Stadium in Srinagar on October 27. The hosts, guided by the relentless aggression and precision of their bowling attack, dismantled the Rajasthan batting line-up and etched a memorable triumph that will resonate across India's domestic cricket landscape.

Resuming on a precarious 41/5, Rajasthan's hopes rested heavily on their lower order. However, Auqib Nabi's devastating spell shattered any prospects of a fightback. 


