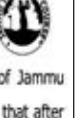

In compliance to the Govt. Order No:- 245-Jk(SWD) of 2025 dated:- 27.10.2025 regarding the restructuring of guidelines of State Marriage Assistance (SMAS) for Poor girls wherein, it was mentioned in the guidelines that from 01-04-2025 onwards to the relaxation of minimum qualification bar of 8th class or equivalent upto 31.03.2028. Hence, all general public are hereby informed through this notice regarding above said of the minimum qualification bar of 8th class under the State Marriage Assistance Scheme. For applicants whose marriage were solemnized w.e.f 01.04.2025 to the issuance of Govt order relaxing the qualification bar but were unable to apply due to the qualification bar, their applications shall be accepted via offline mode through TSWO/DSWO/Deputy commissioner office who will verify and process these applications by certifying that the marriage was solemnized on/after 1st April 2025 and the applicant could not apply due to qualification bar. However, the applications of such cases where marriage are to be solemnized within 35 days (a breathing time) after the issuance of the Government Order relaxing the qualification bar, shall also submit the applications through offline mode.
