Maiden Wushu Ranking event at Jammu from Nov 2

JAMMU: The Association of India (WAI) is organizing 1st Ranking tournament-cum-selection trials at Indoor Hall, Bhagwati Nagar, here from November two to November four.

"In view of the 20th Asian Games 2026, the Wushu Association of India will conduct this ranking tournament among the shortlisted athletes identified during the earlier selection trials held at Srinagar and Manipur," informed chief coach of India, Kuldeep Handoo.

In addition, the technical committee has decided to include the first two position holders of the All India Police Games (Sanda division) and the gold medalists in the Taolu event to further enhance the team's overall performance for the upcoming Asian Games.

The proposed tournaments will continue to be conducted every two months until June

2026, which marks the deadline for the final entries for the Asian Games.

During the Sanda selection trials held at Srinagar, eight top athletes were shortlisted for the ranking events, while in Taolu, four positions were finalized during the trials conducted at Manipur.

The Wushu Association of India has also requested the Sports Authority of India (SAI) to organize a National Wushu Coaching Camp for the top four athletes in both Sanda

Furthermore, the top two position holders will be sent for foreign exposure training in China for a duration of 60 days, commencing in December 2025.
