

SSP Jammu emphasizes zero tolerance towards drugs, organized crime

JAMMU: Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Jammu, Joginder Singh, held a comprehensive crime and security review meeting at District Police Lines on Monday. The meeting was attended by all Zonal SSPs, SP Operations Jammu, DDP Jammu, SDPOs, DySP DAR, senior prosecuting officers of DPO Jammu, Incharge FSL Unit DPL Jammu, and all SHOs of Jammu District. The Deputy Director

Prosecution highlighted key issues related to the professional investigation of NDPS cases, urging officers to ensure compliance with vital provisions to secure convictions against drug peddlers. In addition to the crime review, discussions focused on strengthening security measures, controlling crime, and maintaining peace and stability across the district. Topics such as quality investigation, time-bound disposal of cases, property and NDPS case clearance, inquest pro-

ceedings, tracking history-sheeters, absconders, and missing persons were thoroughly reviewed. Special attention was given to the disposal of cases registered under both old and new criminal laws, emphasizing the completion of investigations within the 60- and 90-day timelines. SSP Jammu directed officers to ensure speedy justice through timely case closures. Progress on CCTNS, e-Sakshaya, SIDs, and e-summons was evaluated, with a

strong push for the mandatory use of FSL services under BNSS provisions. Officers discussed achievements and challenges related to forensic services with the FSL unit in detail. The SSP urged officers to adopt citizen-centric policing and ensure safety, security, and quick response to public concerns. He reiterated the policy of zero tolerance towards drug trafficking, instructing identification and strict action against all drug peddlers.

He also directed that surveillance on released organized criminal elements be intensified and that necessary measures be taken to curb their activities to eliminate any public fear of criminal threats. Emphasis was also placed on implementation of Zero FIRs and e-FIRs, and reducing case pendency through qualitative and quantitative investigations. Reiterating a zero-tolerance policy towards corruption, crime burking, and indiscipline, SSP Joginder Singh stressed the importance of politeness, efficiency, and empathy in public dealings. He lauded the commendable role of Jammu Police personnel during the recent floods, highlighting their timely alerts, evacuations, and rescues in coordination with civil administration, SDRF, NDRF, and other forces, which saved hundreds of lives in Jammu District.

Cyber Crime awareness workshop empowers officers in J-S-K Range

JAMMU: A one-day workshop on Cyber Crimes and Cybersecurity was organized on Monday at the Conference Hall, District Police Lines Jammu, drawing participation from nearly 200 police officers, including probationary DySPs and SIs, along with members of the media fraternity from across the Jammu-Samba-Kathua (JSK) Range. The workshop was inaugurated by DIG JKS Range Shiv Kumar Sharma, in the presence of SSP Jammu Joginder Singh, and other senior officers.

The event aimed to equip police personnel with essential knowledge and tools to tackle the rising threat of cybercrime and to promote safer digital practices. The keynote address was delivered by Mohd. Yaseen Kichloo, Senior Superintendent of Police at the Cyber Crime Investigation Centre for Excellence (CICE), J&K, who served as the guest speaker. In his comprehensive

presentation, SSP Kichloo highlighted the evolving nature of cyber threats, stressing the need for continuous learning and vigilance. He shared case studies from recent cybercrime investigations and emphasized the importance of early reporting and awareness in preventing such crimes. Key topics discussed during the workshop included online financial frauds, phishing and vishing attacks, email bombing, skimming, social media safety, steganography, salami attacks, and the dangers of cyber pornography. SSP Kichloo also outlined preventive measures and cyber hygiene practices to help officers and the public stay secure in the digital world. The event included interactive sessions, allowing participants to raise concerns and ask technical questions. Officers from different units shared field experiences and sought advice on handling emerging cyber threats. The distribution of educational

material further reinforced the learning outcomes of the session. DIG Shiv Kumar Sharma lauded the initiative, emphasizing the importance of community engagement and digital literacy, noting that "awareness is our first line of defense." He urged police officers to take the knowledge gained into the field and educate the public on digital safety. SSP Jammu Joginder Singh reaffirmed the department's commitment to public safety, stating that proactive measures and collaboration between law enforcement and the public are vital to building a secure cyber environment. The event concluded with a vote of thanks by SP Headquarters Jammu, Irshad Hussain Rather, who expressed gratitude to the resource persons, guests, and participants for making the event impactful. He particularly acknowledged the efforts of DIG JKS Range and SSP Jammu in organizing the timely and relevant workshop.
