## IGNOU extends deadline for December 2025 **TEE Exam Form and Assignment Submission**

JAMMU: Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) has extended the last date for submission of the online examination form for the December 2025 Term-End Examination (TEE) until  $20 {\rm th}$  October 2025 without any late fee. From  $21 {\rm st}$  to  $26 {\rm th}$  October 2025, students can still submit the exam form by paying a late fee of Rs 1100. The examination fee remains Rs 200 per course.

Students must submit their exam forms via the SAMARTH platform by logging into their student account at [http://exam.ignou.ac.in](http://exam.ignou.ac.in). New users must first complete the registration process through the "New Registration" option. The December 2025 TEE is tentatively scheduled from 1st December 2025 to 8th January 2026.

Hall tickets/admit cards will be released in November 2025, and the tentative exam schedule is subject to change. Exam centre allocation will be done on a first-come, first-served basis. If the preferred centre reaches full capacity, students must choose an alternative nearby centre. No requests for change in exam centres or courses will be entertained after submission.

IGNOU has also extended the assignment submission deadline to 31st October 2025 for all programmes for the December TEE. Assignments are crucial, carrying 30% weightage in final evaluation. Dr. Sandeep Gupta, Regional Director, IGNOU Regional Centre Jammu, urged students to carefully read instructions before form submission. He emphasized that no changes will be allowed post-submission and that Learner Support Centres (LSCs) have been directed to assist students with assignment submissions. The University retains the right to reschedule or cancel exams due to unforeseen circumstances at any exam centre across India. Students are advised to complete their submissions in time to avoid last-minute issues.

## All J&K Plus 2 Lecturers Forum expresses concern over delay in Regularisation, other issues

Lecturers Forum held a UTlevel virtual meeting on Monday, presided over by RS Salathia, Chairman, and Mohd Younous Gurezi, President Kashmir Division. Senior leader R.K. Padroo conducted the proceedings.

The Forum, in a united voice, expressed strong concern over the inordinate delay in the regularisation of incharge lecturers, the pending transfer list under ATD, the long-overdue ACP, and the delay in posting of elevated Principals

Chairman RS Salathia, Younous Gurezi, Jvoti Prakash, and Khateeb Ahmed criticised the School Education Department (SED) for its indifferent approach.

They revealed that despite several meetings with Minister for School Education Sakina Masood Itoo and Secretary SED Ram Niwas Sharma, no concrete steps have been taken.

The incharge lecturers, whose need for releasing the ATD list JAMMU: The All J&K +2 regularisation should have been for Jammu division and repacompleted within six months. continue to suffer despite clearance of their one-time exemption files. The Forum highlighted that

the Minister had fixed July 31, 2025, as the deadline for finalising the DPC for regularisation, but the directive was ignored. Even directions from the Chief Secretary and CAT orders have gone unheeded. The Forum warned that if

immediate action is not taken. they may resort to a pen-down strike across J&K, followed by protests.

On the ACP and ATD, the leadership urged the government to resolve these longpending demands, calling ACP a rightful entitlement of the  $\pm 2$ cadre.
