of lives," he stated.  
In contrast, the PM maintained, today's India gives a befitting response to terror attacks and strikes by entering inside the home of enemies.

"For us, nothing is more important than the safety and security of our nation and its citizens," Modi asserted, referring to Operation Sindoor launched by Indian armed forces against terror hubs in Pakistan in May after the Pahalgam massacre.

Without naming the Opposition Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA), which was in power in Maharashtra from November 2019 to June 2022, Modi said the Mumbai region has got a second international airport after a long wait and added the earlier regime created hurdles in development because of rampant corruption.

"This (creating hurdles in development) is no less than committing a sin," he noted.

"Gati" (speed) and 'pragati' (development) are hallmarks of a Viksit Bharat (developed India) where people's welfare is top most priority," he said, adding the country is going in that direction in the last 11 years of the BJP-led rule at the Centre.

Be it Vande Bharat trains, expediting the bullet train project, building new highways, expressways tunnels, sea bridges or linking new cities, speed and development can be seen everywhere in the country, Modi said.

The Navi Mumbai International Airport, with its shape of the lotus, provides a glimpse of viksit Bharat, the PM stated.

"The airport is located on the land of Shivaji Maharaj. It is a symbol of culture and prosperity. Farmers and fisherfolk can now get access to global markets because of the airport," Modi said.

The Prime Minister said in 2014, when he assumed office, there were 74 airports in the country, but their number has now gone up to more than 160.

"India has become the third largest domestic aviation market in the world. With new aircraft orders, there is opportunity for more pilots, cabin crew, ground workers, repair maintenance. By the end of this decade, India will be a Maintenance, Repair and Overhaul (MRO) hub," he declared.

Modi said with the new international airport and the underground metro corridor, the metropolis will become Asia's largest connectivity hub with seamless travel and connectivity due to the 'Mumbai One' app launched on Wednesday.

with the BJP? No, the doors of the BJP are closed for you. The BJP has no need to form the government with you. If anyone has made an offer to you, confirm it publicly, or else apologise to the people of Jammu and Kashmir, and say that you lied," Sharma said.

Chief Minister Omar Abdullah, while speaking at an event in Aachabal area of Anantnag district last week, had said that the National Conference could have joined hands with the BJP like the PDP did in 2015, but he did not, because "I am not ready to make that trade".

Abdullah stated that had he included the BJP in the government, the statehood to Jammu and Kashmir might have been restored sooner. He stressed that he would rather resign than enter into an alliance with the BJP to hasten statehood.

Responding to the remarks, Sharma said that it was Abdullah who was knocking the BJP's doors.

"Will the BJP go to him (Abdullah) to form the government? You knock the BJP's doors. We don't want to say which leaders you met. When your recent offer was rejected, you are now making noise. This is the height of political shamelessness," Sharma said.

The LoP said Abdullahs were habitual liars and accused them of trying to drum up hatred against the BJP and the Centre.

"They have a habit of lying to the people. They want total friendship in Delhi, but try to create an atmosphere against the Centre in Kashmir," Sharma alleged.

Referring to Abdullah's meeting with Union ministers in New Delhi, Sharma said he presents shawls and bouquets to them, has tea and even eats with them, "but in Jammu and Kashmir, he says he will not allow the BJP to form the government here".

"Abdullah is working on a tool kit to promote hatred against the BJP and Central government for political gains in the Budgam bypolls," Sharma added.

be hiding in remote forest areas in Rajouri and Udhampur districts, officials said.

While a brief encounter took place between police and some terrorists in Beeranthub area of Kandi in Rajouri on Tuesday evening, three suspected terrorists were also noticed moving in Dharni top area of Basantgarh in Udhampur.

Police assisted by army and CRPF strengthened the cordon around the areas and a massive search operation was launched this morning to track down and neutralise the terrorists, the officials said.

They said the cordon and search operation was extended to adjoining areas but there was no fresh contact with the terrorists so far.

Inspector General of Police, Jammu, Bhim Sen Tuti said on Tuesday that "Exchange of fire took place between terrorists and SOG (Special Operations Group) team in Beeranthub area, Police Station Kandi, Rajouri. Joint parties of police, Army and CRPF have rushed to the spot and cordoned off the area."

## Op Sindoor restored...

"Our performance in Operation Sindoor fills us with professional pride. We proved to the world how air power can be effectively used in shaping military outcomes in just a few days," he said.

The Chief of Air Staff described Operation Sindoor as a shining example of what can be achieved through "meticulous planning, disciplined training and determined execution".

"India's bold and precise attacks restored the rightful place

of offensive air action in the national consciousness," he said. "Our robust air-defence architecture and offensive employment of long-range surface-to-air missile systems limited the adversary's ability to operate and ensured the safety of our vital assets," he said.

"The outstanding performance of the indigenously-developed and integrated weapons, which delivered precise and devastating blows deep inside enemy territory, vindicates our faith in home-grown capabilities," he said.

In response to the April 22 Pahalgam attack, India launched Operation Sindoor on May 7, using air power to destroy several terror infrastructures in territories controlled by Pakistan.

The strikes triggered four days of intense clashes that ended with an understanding on stopping the military actions on May 10. Last week, Singh said at least a dozen Pakistani military aircraft, including US-origin F-16 jets and Chinese-origin JF-17s, were destroyed or damaged in Indian strikes during Operation Sindoor.

In his remarks, the air chief marshal also noted that the increasing pace of integration of new systems, weapons and equipment into the IAF's operational plans has been a "significant success".

"I can see that there is an increased culture of accountability, safety and security amongst the air warriors and this is directly reflecting in our reduced incidents and accidents," he said.

Machail Mata yatra also resumed this morning with the improvement in the overall weather conditions, the officials said.

After day-long closure due to multiple landslides, the officials said the traffic on Jammu-Srinagar national highway resumed this morning.

"Jammu-Srinagar National Highway (NH-44) has not been fully restored...the road is in poor condition at Tharad (Udhampur), Nashri-Dalwas and between Marog and Kishtwari Pather (Ramban), therefore only one-way traffic of Light Motor Vehicles was allowed from Srinagar towards Jammu this morning," a traffic department official said.

He said the Mughal road connecting Poonch and Rajouri districts in Jammu with south Kashmir's Shopian district is cleared of snow at Peer Ki Gali and is open for light motor vehicles from both sides.

The traffic on Kishtwar-Sinthan-Anantnag road, also another alternative link between Jammu and Srinagar, is still closed due to snow accumulation at Sinthan top, the official said.

# SSP Doda reviews crime and security scenario of Sub-Division Bhaderwah

DODA: Senior Superintendent of Police (SSP) Doda, Sandeep Mehta (JKPS), today conducted a comprehensive crime and security review meeting at Police Station Bhaderwah, which was attended by Addl. SP Bhaderwah, SDPO Bhaderwah, Station House Officers (SHOs) of Police Stations Bhaderwah and Thathri, and In-Charges of Police Posts falling under their jurisdictions.

The meeting focused on reviewing heinous cases including murder, attempt to murder, NDPS, UAPA, and rape/POCSO offences, besides assessing progress

on time-bound investigations governed by the 60-90-day legal schedules.

Case-by-case discussions were held on all ongoing investigations and backlog matters from the current year. SSP Mehta emphasized the importance of quality investigation, timely filing of chargesheets, and ensuring justice to victims. All pending timeline cases were thoroughly examined, and directions were issued to expedite investigations and maximize disposals within the stipulated periods. He also stressed investigative efficiency, accountability, mandatory use of FSL services, and strict adherence to legal deadlines, along with

the uploading of success stories under the New Criminal Laws on the designated portal.

SSP Mehta further directed supervisory officers and investigating officers (IOs) to maintain close surveillance over suspects, drug addicts, OGWs (Over-Ground Workers), trouble-makers, miscreants, and rumor-mongers, and to take preventive measures to uphold law and order. He called for an intensified crackdown on drug peddlers, identification of their supply networks, and decisive action against major suppliers.

Operational officers were instructed to keep a strict

vigil on the activities of Anti-National Elements (ANEs) operating in the higher reaches of Bhaderwah and adjoining areas. SSP Mehta directed that inputs be properly analyzed and acted upon promptly, with a focus on dismantling support networks of ANEs and generating actionable intelligence.

Concluding the meeting, SSP Mehta urged all officers to redouble efforts to reduce case pendency and meet the targets set by senior functionaries, reaffirming that the ultimate objective of Doda Police is to provide a safe, secure, and crime-free environment for the people of the Sub-Division as well as the District.

## Terror accused involved in killing of Sarpanch sentenced to life imprisonment

DODA: Doda Police secured the conviction of a terror accused namely Irfan Ali, son of Shafqat Ali, resident of Kilhotran, Tehsil Gandoh, for offences punishable under Sections 302/34 of the Ranbir Penal Code (RPC) and Section 7/27 of the Arms Act for the imprisonment of life.

The case originated from an FIR No. 57/2002, registered at Police Station Gandoh on 04-07-2002, following the cold-blooded murder of an innocent civilian who happened to be the Sarpanch of his area Sh. Sher Mohd r/o Changa Gandoh, by the accused and his associates affiliated with a militant outfit. After committing the gruesome murder, the accused fled the scene.

A comprehensive investigation, led by the then Station House Officer of Police Station Gandoh, culminated in the filing of a challan before the Court of Principal Sessions Judge, Bhaderwah, on 28-05-2019. The accused had remained in judicial custody since 2019. After an extensive trial spanning over six years, the Sessions Court, Bhaderwah, vide its order dated 08-10-2025, found the accused guilty and sentenced him to life imprisonment for his barbaric act. The prosecution of the case was effectively conducted by K.K. Bandral, Chief Prosecuting Officer (CPO) Bhaderwah. This conviction stands as a testament to the unwavering commitment of Doda Police to ensure justice for victims of terrorism and to uphold peace, justice, and the rule of law in the district.
