NEW DELHI: Amid protests by a section of farmers against the recently enacted farm laws, Prime Minister Narendra Modi asserted on Sunday that these reforms have opened doors of new opportunities for farmers and bestowed on them new rights.

In his monthly 'Mann Ki Baat' broadcast, Modi said the farm laws have begun mitigating the troubles of farmers in a short period of time since their enactment in September as he cited the example of a Maharashtra farmer who used their provisions to get the money a trader had promised but not paid to him in time.

New dimensions related to agriculture and related fields have emerged as the recently enacted farm reforms have opened doors of new possibilities for farmers, he said.

SEC informed that a total of 85,363 electors exercised their franchise in these historic elections, which began at 7:00 AM with culmination at 2:00 PM, against 1,43,592 electors for both Sarpanch and Panch vacant constituencies



### 471 new COVID cases, 5 deaths in J&K

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Sunday recorded 471 new coronavirus cases, pushing the tally to 10,9,854, while the death toll reached 1,685 with five more fatalities, officials said

Of the fresh cases, 260 were reported from the Jammu division and 211 from the Kashmir division, they said.

The officials said Jammu district recorded the highest of 122 cases, followed by 86 in Srinagar.

There are 5,087 active cases as of now in the UT, while 10,3,082 patients have recovered, they said

Five COVID-19 deaths were reported in the UT in the past 24 hours -- three from Jammu and two from Kashmir regions.
