Class 12th exams begin in Chenab region, COVID SoPs in place for students

BHADARWAH: The class 12th annual regular (2021) examinations commences across Chenab region on Tuesday under winter zone of Jammu Division. The examination is being conducted by the JK Board of School Education (BOSE).

As per the official figures around 1200 students have appeared for the examination in Bhadarwah Zone for which JK Board has set up dozens of examination centres in government and private schools.

Arif Rana, Teacher and Examiner said that we have also set up an exam centres as per guidelines. He said all the preparations have been done as per the guide-

lines issued by the State Executive Committee for complete adherence to the Covid19 protocol.

Rana said that students are being allowed to appear in the examination only after getting written consent from parents.

According to an official,

the number of examinations has increased to ensure proper distance is maintained between the examinees in the examination halls. "Only 50 percent seating capacity will be occupied in one exam hall in order to maintain proper distance," he said.

As already reported, the students appearing in class 10th to 12th annual examination have been given 30 percent relaxation in syllabus by the JK Board, in view of the prevailing COVID-19 pandemic.

The students have to attempt 70 percent marks from the question paper which will be treated as 100 percent for result computation. The JK Board has however reduced the time allotted for attempting the question papers during examination. The papers having three hours duration shall be having only two and a half hours time period for attempting the questions.

It is notable that the state executive committee of the

department of Disaster Management J&K has already ordered that students appearing in the class 10th and 12th annual examination should carry parents' consent along on each day of their examinations.

Meanwhile students were very excited to appear in the examination in their schools as due to covid19 restrictions, they were unable to visit their schools since last two years.

Students Sakshi and Alifa Sajjad demanded that in view of Covid-19 restrictions and far off areas, JKBOSE authorities should consider all the circumstances and marking and result should be prepared accordingly.



Army, CRPF Jawans donate blood for accident victims

BHADARWAH: In view of

frequent natural Calamities and repeated road accidents

in Doda district, jawans of Rashtriya Rifles based at Bhadarwah and 33 Bn CRPF volunteered themselves to donate blood especially to save the lives of accident victims in a special blood donation camp organised by National Health Mission Jammu and Kashmir with sub district Hospital Bhadarwah.

District Doda which is prone to frequent natural Calamities and repeated road accidents and during last one month, Doda district has seen half a dozen (2 at Khellani, Khamni Top, Gatsu)

terrifying road accidents, resulting in the deaths of 20 people and nearly 25 got seriously injured. In a show of massive compassion towards the victims, 60-strong contingent of the Jawans of 4RR and 33 Bn CRPF personnel made their way to Special Blood donation camp of NHM Jammu, where they volunteered to donate blood to the GMC Doda and SDH Bhadarwah hospital's blood banks in order to facilitate better treatment for the victim in case of emergency.

Of the sixty, 30 each from 4RR and 33 Bn CRPF have already donated blood and the remaining officers are on standby. According to BMO Bhadarwah Dr Shakeel Ahmed Sumbria.

Commandant 33 Bn CRPF said that this programme of CRPF will certainly help in developing better police-public interface. Due to this blood donation camp, District Doda will keep the blood in Reserve which can be utilised by the Health workers during Medical emergency i.e. during Vehicle accidents/ Natural calamity etc to save the life of critically injured victims.
