support system to cater 24/7 services to JakLRMa agency user, state public user, special agency external user for analysis, evaluation and information of revenue records and its ancillary details like Records of Rights, Jamabandi, Girdawari, Mutation and many more.

The Deputy Commissioner said that the IEC campaign on the LRIS application is carried out at each niyabat/village centre wherein trained revenue officials are providing necessary information in addition to these weekly IEC campaigns.
