The Indian soldiers do get leave to go home from the positions on LAC at least twice a year if not thrice, he said, adding that the Chinese soldiers do not have this luxury.

"They are building this infrastructure, this kind of so-called villages, which are well within their side of the LAC. They have not transgressed anywhere on our perception of the LAC," he said.

He said there are different perceptions of the LAC but the Indian armed forces know where the LAC lies because they have been told that this is your alignment of the LAC and this is the territory you are expected to defend.

"Chinese have a perception and in some areas, we know about it, and in some areas, we don't know about it. Because they have never really explained where the LAC lies according to their perception," he noted.

When asked if he thinks such village development is muscle-flexing on their part, he replied: "Certainly not, I won't call it muscle-flexing. With the development of these villages, they are trying to make sure that they reach out to their border areas, and it is something we should also be doing."

India was also concerned about its border area development and the government has released funds for BADP (Border Area Development Programme) projects, he mentioned.

"In fact, we are encouraging people to go there and stay back in those villages because a large number of villages along the LAC are being vacated. Why are they being vacated? Because people find job opportunities, education, health infrastructure, more in the inner areas," he explained.

Last month, India and China failed to make any headway in resolving the 18-month standoff in the remaining friction points in eastern Ladakh during the 13th round of military talks between the two countries.

Each side currently has around 50,000 to 60,000 troops along the LAC in the sensitive sector of eastern Ladakh.

positive for COVID-19 on re-testing, they will immediately self isolate and report to their nearest health facility or call national helpline number (1075)/ state helpline number.

On arrival debording should be done ensuring physical distancing and thermal screening would be carried out in respect of all the passengers by the health officials present at the airport.

The self-declaration form filled online shall be shown to the airport health staff. The passengers found to be symptomatic during screening shall be immediately isolated and taken to medical facility according to health protocol. If tested positive, their contacts shall be identified and managed according to laid down protocol.

Contacts of the suspect case are the co-passengers seated in the same row, three rows in front and three rows behind along with identified cabin crew. Also, all the community contacts of those travellers who have tested positive (during home quarantine period) would be subjected to quarantine for 14 days and tested as per ICMR protocol , the guidelines stated.

Meanwhile, Ladakh has recorded 15 fresh Covid cases, taking the infection tally in the Union territory to 21,087, while the active cases went up to 129, officials said.

The region has registered 209 Covid-related deaths -- 151 in Leh and 58 in Kargil -- since the outbreak of the pandemic last year.

Eleven patients were cured and discharged from hospitals in Leh. The total number of cured patients is 20,749, they said.

Of the total 15 fresh cases, all of these cases were reported in Leh, they said.

A total of 425 sample reports in Ladakh were found negative, they said.

Rs 12,200 fine recovered from SoPs violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing the drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, Enforcement teams on Thursday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 12,200. The Enforcement officers urged people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 2,408 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Thursday.

As per daily bulletin issued by Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, Health Department has collected 1,697 samples including 378 RT-PCR and 1,318 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 2,408 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

Eight vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police team of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli, Police Posts Chatha and Chinore acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized eight different vehicles found involved in illegal mining.

The seized vehicles include a tipper (JK20 4175), a tipper and a tractor-trolley without registration numbers seized by Jhajjar Kotli police; 1 tipper (JK14B 8692), 2 tractors and 1 dumper without registration numbers seized by Chatha police and a tractor bearing temporary number seized by Chinore police. ARTO Rajouri suspends 10 route permits for various violations

RAJOURI: Assistant Regional Transport Officer Rajouri, Shami Kumar Sharma has suspended route permits of 10 tempos for violating different traffic rules during a special drive. The drive was conducted on the directions of the Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Rajesh K Shavan.

Pertinently, several complaints of overcharging are being received from the passengers. The checking squad of Motor Vehicle Department Rajouri, headed by ARTO conducted checking on various routes and found that the passengers were being overcharged, which is a serious offence under MVA norms.

Acting tough against violators, ARTO suspended the route permits of 10 tempos for two months. The ARTO has made it clear that such drives shall continue in near future to keep a check on over-charging, overloading and other traffic offences and strict action as per MVA norms would be initiated against violators. He also appealed to the public to follow traffic norms in letter and spirit and avoid using mobile phones, stunting, use of beams during night, avoiding seat-belts etc. He said these are common offences which can be easily avoided. The ARTO urged the drivers to be mindful of duties and responsibilities while driving.

Absconding drug-peddler arrested

JAMMU: Police on Thursday arrested a drug peddler who was absconding for last 2 months.

As per details, a drug peddler cum absconder namely Irfan Rashid Rather, son of Abdul Rasheed Rather, resident of Khanpora Dayalgam, Anantnag who was wanted in FIR No 364/2021 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Ac since August 28, 2021, has finally been arrested.

Disciplinary authority should...

Act clearly indicates that the authorities are empowered to award punishment of suspension or dismissal to a member of the force who is found guilty.

The apex court's judgement came on an appeal filed by the Centre against an order of the Delhi High Court which substituted the penalty of removal from service inflicted on the employee after holding disciplinary inquiry with confinement from 1 pm to 10 pm in quarter guard jail.

The constable was accused of misbehaving and abusing and injuring a doctor while on official duty and instituting false criminal charges of sexual harassment against him.

The apex court said that the nature of allegations against the constable are indeed grave as the respondent not only threatened the Doctor complainant but has misbehaved and abused and injured him and made false allegations against him of sexual harassment to his wife.

"Such a nature of misconduct which has been committed by the respondent once stand proved is unpardonable and if the authority has considered it appropriate to punish him with the penalty of removal from service by an Order dated July 14, 2004, and confirmed by the appellate/revisional authority and by the High Court in the impugned judgement leaves no sympathy for retention in service and that too in a disciplined force like CRPF," the bench said.

diplomatic means and will continue to do so in the future.

"Further, as conveyed earlier the government has also stepped up border infrastructure including the construction of roads, bridges etc, which has provided much-needed connectivity to the local population along the border," he said.

In its recent report, the US Department of Defence said China built a large 100-home civilian village inside disputed territory between its Tibet Autonomous Region and India's Arunachal Pradesh in the eastern sector of the Line of Actual Control (LAC).

Sources in the security establishment on Tuesday said the village along the disputed border in the upper Subansiri district is in an area that was occupied by the People's Liberation Army (PLA) after overrunning an Assam Rifles post in 1959.

Following the eastern Ladakh standoff last year, India has bolstered its overall military preparedness along the LAC in the Arunachal Pradesh sector as well.

Eastern Army Commander Lt Gen Manoj Pande said last month that China has increased the intensity of its military exercises and deployment of troops in its depth areas opposite the LAC in the Arunachal Pradesh sector.

He said that India has correspondingly readied contingency plans to deal with any eventualities.

Lt Gen Pande had said new villages have come up on the Chinese side of the border in certain areas and India has taken note of it in its operational strategy.

Burglary case solved: 2 arrested, stolen property worth lakhs recovered
