(Riyaz) was assigned to carry out similar kind of fidayeen attack. Digital evidences recovered from his mobile show that he was prepared by terror outfit for fidayeen attack, the spokesman said.

In another overnight encounter in Kulgam district of south Kashmir, two terrorists, including a district commander of the HM outfit, were killed.

Security forces launched a cordon and search operation in Chancer village in the Chawalgam area of Kulgam on Thursday following inputs about the presence of terrorists there.

During the search operation, as the presence of terrorists got ascertained, they were given opportunity to surrender; however, they fired indiscriminately upon the joint search party. The joint teams ensuring safety of civilians rescued and shifted them to safer places. The fire was retaliated leading to an encounter, the spokesman said.

In the initial exchange of fire, one terrorist was killed. However, due to darkness, the operation was suspended for the night, he said.

The spokesman said in the early hours of Friday, repeated announcements were made to the hiding terrorist to surrender but he fired on the joint search party which was retaliated leading to his elimination.

The dead bodies of both the killed terrorists were retrieved from the site of the encounter; he added.

He identified them as district commander of proscribed outfit Hizbul Mujahideen Shiraz Ahmad alias Shiraz Molvi alias Abu Haris, a resident of Souch Kulgam, and Yawar Ahmad Bhat, a resident of Ponipora Kulgam.

As per police records, both the killed terrorists were linked with proscribed terror outfit HM and were part of groups involved in several terror crimes including attacks on security forces and civilian atrocities, the spokesman said.

Shiraz Ahmad was an A++ (plus plus) categorised terrorist and was active since 2016, figuring among the list of most wanted terrorists, he said.

He was also involved in recruiting innocent youth into terror ranks and in spreading a reign of terror by killing civilians as well as political workers in Devsar and Brazloo areas of Kulgam. There are 15 FIRs registered against him for several terror crimes, the spokesman said.

Incriminating material and arms and ammunition including an AK-rifle and a pistol were recovered from the Kulgam encounter site. An AK-rifle was also recovered from the Bemina encounter site, he said.

The recovered material has been taken into case records for further investigation. Police have registered cases under relevant sections of law and investigations have been initiated, he added.

The spokesman said Inspector General of Police (IGP), Kashmir, Vijay Kumar has congratulated the joint teams for carrying out both the operations in a professional manner resulting in elimination of three terrorists including a most wanted terrorist. Kumar also congratulated police and security forces for working with great synergy and coordination on the ground that lead to the killing of 133 terrorists including many top commanders during this year.

any HoD office, which is yet to initiate the implementation of E-office, shall immediately contact the Nodal Officer (s) notified for the purpose vide the aforementioned Government Order; by or before 20th of November; 2021 for any further assistance/ handholding, after which it shall be presumed that all HoDs are functioning on E-office only.

"Further, failure of any Head of the Department in switching over to e-office mode shall be his/her personal responsibility and shall invite appropriate action," reads the order.

It is further clarified that HoD office(s) whose scanning activities has/have not yet been started shall immediately start using E-office with current Dak, without waiting for scanning of all files/documents. The scanning of such left over files/dak of these Departments shall start separately, for which the roster shall be issued by Information Technology Department.

In order to ensure the compliance to the above directions, the order stated, "it is enjoined upon all Administrative Secretaries to intervene personally and issue necessary directions to all the concerned that communications/files are entertained only through E-office mode from their HoDs after 30th November, 2021."

Lamenting that banking, pension and insurance sector used to be like an exclusive

Two drug peddlers arrested, huge quantity of psychotropic substance recovered

PULWAMA: Continuing its efforts to curb menace of drugs, Police on Friday arrested 2 drug peddlers in Pulwama and recovered huge quantity of psychotropic substance from their possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Rajpora during patrolling in Putrigam area intercepted a suspicious person, who on seeing police party tried to flee from the spot, however, alert police party apprehended him tactfully. He was identified as Aijaz Ahmad Darzi, son of Ab Rasheed Darzi, resident of Kharpora Murran and during search, 20 bottles of Codeine Phosphate was recovered from his possession.

During questioning, he disclosed that he has received psychotropic substance from one Aijaz Ahmad Najar, son of Gh Nabi Najar, resident of Batamurran Shadimarg. Acting swiftly, a police party raided the spot and recovered 2,000 bottles of Codeine Phosphate from residence of Aijaz Ahmad. Both the drug peddlers were arrested and shifted to police station, where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 209/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Rajpora and further investigation started. More arrests and recoveries are expected in coming days.

Drug peddler nabbed with 8.5 gm heroin

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Jammu Police recovered 8.5 gm heroin from a drug peddler.

He was arrested and case under relevant sections was registered against him at Police Station Bahu Fort. The overall arrest and recovery was made under supervision of SDPO City East Sajad Sarwar.



Absconder nabbed after 2 years
