

Div Com interacts with DDC, BDC & Municipal Committee members at Rajouri

Directs Officers to cooperate with PRIs; asks for timely completion of development projects

RAJOURI: Divisional Commissioner Jammu, Dr Raghav Langer on Wednesday reviewed the developmental scenario of district Rajouri in a joint meeting of District/sectoral Officer on 1st day of his two day visit to the Border District.

Vice-Chairman DDC Rajouri, Shabir Khan; Deputy Commissioner, Rajesh K Shavan, besides DDC members, BDC chairpersons and officers of line departments attended the meeting.

The DDCs, BDCs put forth their demands, seeking early registration of contractors for Panchayat level works, defined protocol for DDC and BDCs, improvement of basic amenities including Power and Drinking water facilities, provision of electric Poles, release of pending salary of daily wagers/need-based workers working in Jal Shakti department, restoration of defunct Filtration plants, adequate staff and monitoring of Public Health Centres, upgrading of Educational infrastructure and adequate staff in schools, buffer stock of Poles and PHE pipes, release of MGN-REGA payments, clearing of

pending payment of border bunkers, Blacklisting of non-performing Contractors, Funds for the blacktopping of internal roads, Start of work under JJM etc.

The Div Com gave a patient hearing to all the demands and issued on the spot instructions to the concerned departments for resolving these issues on priority. He also assured that rest of the issues would be considered for early redress.

Responding to the issue of release of payment of Border bunkers, he said two types of bunkers i.e. under MHA grants and Languishing projects and the payment for untendered works has been made by the government of which 25 per cent funds have been released for disbursement. He also directed for immediate clearance of the payments and submission of

UCs for seeking more funds. He further informed that the issue of languishing bunkers has been taken up with the government.

Tendering of works is being carried out as per GFR and for transparency, accountability of the works and time-bound execution of works.

Regarding the registration of contractors, the DDC informed that 2500 persons have been roped in and no file is pending.

The Div Com stressed on extending handholding to rural youth for registering them as contractors. He instructed concerned departments to fix a day for the registration of contractors and resolve the issue.

Responding to the complaints of non-cooperation of the line Department with the PRIs, the Div Com directed the DC to take cognizance of

the issue and ensure that proper protocol and cooperation is maintained with Panchayat institution representatives.

The Div Com also stressed on timeline execution of works and warned that no laxity in this regard will be tolerated.

The Chief Education Officer was asked to go for rationalization of teachers to overcome the shortage of staff in the schools as reported by the PRIs.

The Vice-Chairman sought the intervention of the Div Com in re-implementation of transfer order of teachers kept in abeyance to overcome the problem of staff in the schools.

Inquiring about the Forest clearance status of proposed projects, the Div Com asked for ensuring minimum disturbance to ecology during the execution of projects, He asked for mapping of infrastructure in the Forest area and uploading the same on

the Parivesh portal.

While reviewing progress under PMAY -G, the Div Com stressed on 100 percent completion of the houses in the district.

He directed DFO and DMO to facilitate the construction and completion of the houses under PMAY G by providing Timber and minor mineral supply, wherever required and permissible.

While reviewing MGNREGA works, he took serious note of slow expenditure and execution of works.

Regarding Jal Jeevan Mission, the meeting was informed that 292 schemes at an estimated cost of Rs 1500 crore have been approved for coverage of 380 villages and the project is in the tendering process.

Reviewing the status of B2V3 works, the Div Com pointed out that the completion rate is very low, and directed the RDD, PWD and JPDCL to expedite the pace of work.

Srinagar records coldest night of season at minus 1.5 degrees Celsius

SRINAGAR: Kashmir reeled under cold conditions as the minimum temperature settled below the freezing point across the valley even as Srinagar recorded the coldest night of the season at minus 1.5 degrees Celsius, officials said on Wednesday.

The minimum temperature across the valley stayed below the freezing point on Tuesday night, MET officials said.

They said the temperature was several degrees below the normal for this part of the season.

Srinagar recorded a low of minus 1.5 degrees Celsius on Tuesday night, down from minus 1.2 degrees Celsius the previous night, they said.

The officials said Pahalgam, which serves as the base camp for annual Amarnath yatra, recorded a low of minus 4.7 degrees Celsius. Pahalgam was the coldest recorded place in Kashmir.

Gulmarg resort in north Kashmir's Baramulla district recorded a minimum temperature of minus 2 degrees Celsius, down from minus 1.2 degrees Celsius the previous night.

The temperature in Kupwara in north Kashmir settled at a low of minus 2 degrees Celsius.

Qazigund, the gateway town to the valley, recorded minus 2.2 degrees Celsius, while as Kokernag, also in south, registered a low of minus 1 degrees Celsius.

The wintry conditions in Kashmir have set in much ahead of the beginning of extreme harsh weather conditions which usually start around the third week of December.

'Chillai Kalan', the 40-day period of harsh winter in Kashmir, begins on December 21 every year.

The Meteorological Department has said the weather is most likely to remain dry till November 23

Light snowfall is likely over extreme north Kashmir parts on November 24, it said.

However, it said, the temperature would stay several degrees below normal.

CBI gets three new Joint Directors

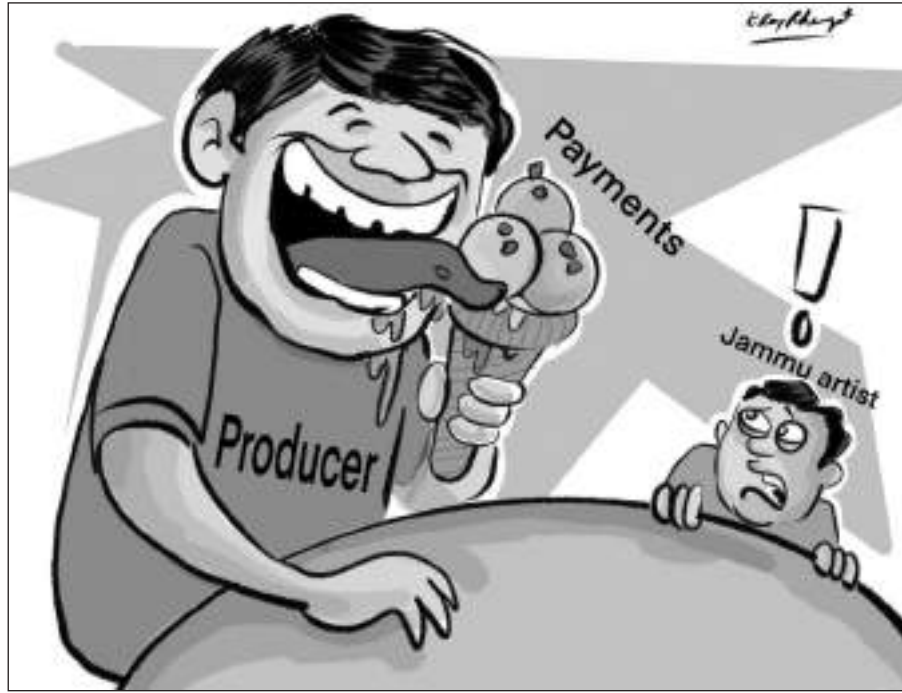

Bajaj, who is from a 1995-batch and belongs to the Maharashtra cadre, will have a combined tenure of five years, i.e. up to June 6, 2026, it said.
