target of 2024, they said. Har Ghar Nal Se Jal', the ambitious campaign, lays out a target of installing functional household tap water connections in eight lakh houses within a period of one month by converging the efforts of all stakeholders, through the implementation support agencies (ISAs), into a mass programme, the officials said.

The Jal Shakti Department in Jammu and Kashmir envisages to provide functional household tap connection (FHTC) capable of providing quality drinking water meeting BIS 10500 standards at the rate of 55 litres per capita per day on a sustainable basis to all unconnected rural households in the UT with piped water supply, they said.

"A total of 5,774 pani samitis and village water and sanitation committees (VWSCs) have been framed and 5,427 village action plans (VAPs) have been prepared in 6,887 villages of J-K," the officials said.

A comprehensive action plan is being executed by the administration to ensure water security by empowering local communities, they said.

Further, gram panchayat and pani samitis are being sensitised for inculcating a sense of ownership and handholding them by conducting regular meetings by the Jal Shakti Department. Members of pani samitis have also been provided with field test kits (FTKs) and are being trained for conducting water quality tests on a regular basis, they added.

Under the mission, 2.16 lakh households were covered in 2020-21. A total of 35,920 households have been provided tap water connections in 2021-22 so far, the officials said.

The coverage has increased from 35 percent in August 2019 to 43 percent ending March 2020 to 56.40 percent as on date, which is above the national average of 44.08 percent, they said.

Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha said every individual has the right to clean drinking water. While substantial progress has been made in increasing access to clean drinking water in the last one and half years, we are making efforts to provide access to safe water for people living in the villages and far flung areas, he said.

"It was agreed that both sides should hold the next (14th) round of the Senior Commanders meeting at an early date to achieve the objective of complete disengagement from all the friction points along the LAC in the Western Sector in accordance with the existing bilateral agreements and protocols," it said.

The eastern Ladakh is officially referred to as Western Sector.

The last round of military talks on October 10 ended in a stalemate following which both sides blamed each other for the impasse.

In a strong statement after the 13th round of talks, the Indian Army said the "constructive suggestions" made by it at the negotiations were neither agreeable to the Chinese side nor could Beijing provide any "forward-looking" proposals.

In its statement, the MEA also referred to the "agreement" between External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and his Chinese counterpart Wang Yi during their meeting in September in Dushanbe that the military and diplomatic officials of the two sides should continue discussions to resolve the remaining issues in eastern Ladakh.

"Accordingly, the two sides had candid and in-depth discussions on the situation along the LAC in Western Sector of India-China border areas and also reviewed the developments since the last meeting of the Senior Commanders of both sides which was held on October 10," it said.

The Chinese foreign ministry said the two sides will continue to work hard to further ease the border situation and strive to "shift from emergency response to normalised control as soon as possible."

In a statement, it said the two sides had a candid and in-depth exchange of views on the recent situation in the China-India border areas at the meeting.

The Chinese foreign ministry said the two sides agreed to consolidate the existing achievements of disengagement, strictly abide by the agreements signed by the two sides and the relevant consensus reached so as to avoid recurrence of the situation on the ground.

"The two sides agreed to maintain dialogue and communication through diplomatic and military channels, actively prepare for the 14th round of military commander-level talks, and make efforts to resolve the remaining issues in the western section of the Sino-Indian border," it said.

Jaishankar and Wang held the talks in Tajikistan's capital Dushanbe on the sidelines of the SCO summit.

The eastern Ladakh border standoff between the Indian and Chinese militaries erupted on May 5 last year following a violent clash in the Pangong lake areas and both sides gradually enhanced their deployment by rushing in tens of thousands of soldiers as well as heavy weaponry.

The tension escalated following a deadly clash in Galwan Valley on June 15 last year.

but also beats in our hearts". "The historic battle of Rezang La, fought at an altitude of 18,000 feet, is difficult to imagine even today. Major Shaitan Singh and his fellow soldiers fought till 'last bullet and last breath' and wrote a new chapter of bravery and sacrifice," he said.

The defence minister tweeted that he paid tributes to the Indian soldiers who made their supreme sacrifice while reaching Rezang La, located amid the inaccessible hills of Ladakh, in the 1962 war.

"The Battle of Rezang La is considered one of the ten greatest and most challenging military conflicts in the world," he said.

The revamped war memorial has been thrown open at a time India and China have been locked in a bitter border standoff in eastern Ladakh for nearly one and half years.

The Indian Army had occupied a number of mountain peaks in Rezang La region in August last year following China's aggressive posturing and failed attempt to intimidate Indian troops.

by the Jammu and Kashmir government into the incident cannot be fair as it was against the principles of justice that the "accused administration investigated the charges against itself".

### SC refuses to...

have been taken for conducting the board exams in offline mode and the number of examination centres have been increased from 6,500 to 15,000.

The bench said it hope and trust that authorities will take all precautions and measures to ensure that no one is exposed to anything untoward in the examination process.

The top court was hearing a plea by six students seeking directions to the CBSE and the CISCE to issue a revised circular for conducting the ensuing class 10 and 12 board exams in the hybrid mode, instead of the offline mode only, amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

During the hearing, senior advocate Sanjay Hegde, appearing for the petitioners, told the bench that this is not adversarial and they are only requesting that option of hybrid mode be also provided to the students to appear in the board examinations.

Hegde said as per the experts, there is possibility of spread of virus at a place of congregation.

Mehta said there are around 34 lakh students who would be appearing in the classes 10 and 12 board examinations.

The exams (of CBSE) have already started on November 16, Mehta said, adding that the authorities have taken care of the concern raised about possibility of spread of the virus.

Let us be very practical about it. The examinations have already started. How can it be made online now, the bench asked Hegde.

The senior advocate said that COVID-19 is an evolving situation and the students should be given the option of appearing in the board examinations through hybrid mode.

It is too late now. It cannot be rescheduled at this stage. Examinations have started, the bench observed.

The plea, seeking a hybrid option in the ensuing board examination, had claimed that the entire exercise of the boards in conducting the term one or semester one examinations in offline mode only is patently unreasonable.

The petition, filed through advocate Sumanth Nookala, had said that the board exams be conducted in hybrid mode with an option to choose between offline and online examinations.

Consent assumes significance as exams directly relate to the mental health of the petitioners requiring a conducive and voluntary atmosphere to ensure a fair assessment. It is common knowledge that the third wave of COVID pandemic is predicted, it had said.

The petition had claimed that the proposed current system of offline examination is fraught with bad planning and lack of application of mind which will further adversely prejudice the students.

Even if the respondents (boards and others) wanted to conduct the examinations on the said dates, it had sufficient time and resources to plan it carefully and consider the concerns raised in the present petition, it had said.
