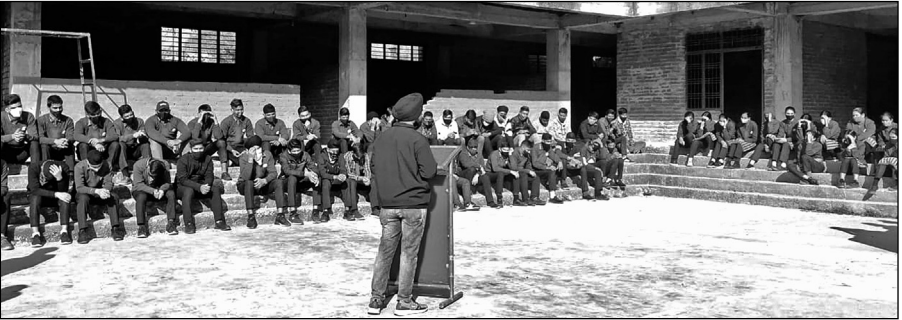

DDC Doda reviews physical, financial progress under District, UT Capex plans; other schemes

DODA: District Development Commissioner Doda Vikas Sharma on Thursday reviewed the physical and financial progress of the works approved under District and UT Capex plan, besides the works approved under other different schemes here at a meeting of key officials of dif- ferent Line Departments held here in the conference hall of DC office.

During the meeting, thread- bare discussion was held with regard to the status of tender- ing of works under PRI grants, district capex, physical progress of the allotted works, expenditure incurred, besides the works of UT Capex plan with specially focus on educa- tion sector. With regard to the

tendering process of works approved under PRI grants by RDD, the DDC directed the concerned authorities to expedite the tendering to complete the works as the set timeline. He asked them to submit the report to the DC office with exact figures which shall include number of works ten- dered, number of works allot- ted, works ready for allot- ment, being tendered, re- tendered after no response and expenditure incurred against the executed works.

Further the DDC asked the ACD, REW and other line departments to collectively resolve the deadlock of those works which are not yet ten- dered so that they shall be pooled in the process, besides asked them to solve the issue

of not feasible works shown by the respective departments in coordination with the JE, BDO and secretary panchay- at concerned and try to settle them into their present nomenclature so that they shall be settled down here oth- erwise they are to be sent to the higher authorities for approval. In addition to this the DDC directed all the departments to ensure that all the works allotted are execut- ed and completed in time bound manner. He further asked them to submit the additional plan against the savings of the tendered works for further submission to con- cerned authorities for approval and optimal use of the allotted funds. While reviewing the progress of

works of school education under District and UT Capex plan, the DDC directed the department and executing agencies to expedite the ten- dering for it being the focus area. He asked the education department to submit the details of the progress achieved under SAMAGRA.

The R&B and health depart- ments were asked to pursue the iconic projects sent to the higher authorities for approval so that these are completed before the set time- line

The meeting was attended by ADDC Doda, CPO Doda, SE PWD, CMO Doda, ACD Doda, ACP Doda, DIO Doda, DSWO Doda, besides other officers of various line departments.

Assistant Director Employment Udhampur (Nodal Officer), Priyanka Gupta, was among several other offi- cials of District Employment & Counseling Centre Udhampur who attended the ceremony.

The AD Employment informed that nine vehi- cles were distributed to unemployed youth of dis- trict Udhampur out of which (02) beneficiaries availed small commercial vehicles of Mahindra (06) beneficiaries availed small commercial vehicles of Tata and (01) Ashoka Leyland company respec- tively.

Informing about the

scheme, she said that the applicants have full liberty to choose any small com- mercial vehicle of any approved models/makes of his/her choice under "MUMKIN" Scheme. The Mission Youth, J&K shall provide an amount of Rs.80000/ or 10% of on- road price of the vehicle (whichever is less) as upfront subsidy. The vehi- cle manufacturer shall also provide an upfront special discount, not less than the amount of subsidy.

The banking partner shall extend the loan facility to the extent of 100% of the on-road price of the vehicle to be purchased without asking for any collateral security.
