

# Rahul Rohit guide India to comfortable win in 2nd T20I, help pocket series

RANCHI: Skipper Rohit Sharma and his deputy KL Rahul stitched an enterprising century-plus opening stand to power India to a comfortable seven-wicket win over New Zealand in the second T20 International and take an unsailable 2-0 lead in the three-match series here on Friday. Chasing a modest 154 under heavy dew condition, the Indian captain and vice-captain started off in contrasting styles en route to their respective half-centuries.

Quiet at start, Rohit stepped up in the middle overs smashing five sixes and one four en route to his 36-ball 55.

Rahul started off in a brisk fashion, and top-scored with 65 from 49 balls with two sixes and six fours in an 117-run opening stand that virtually sealed the chase.

The Indian skipper is now



involved in the most century-plus stands (13), overtaking 12 by Babar Azam and Martin Guppill.

The duo got out in the space of 13 balls but by then India needed just 19 off 27 balls and Rishabh Pant sealed the issue with a straight six over Jimmy Neesham's head in the 18th over to take India home with 16 balls to spare.

The third and final T20I is

scheduled to be played at the iconic Eden Gardens in Kolkata on Sunday.

Rahul made his aggressive intent clear from the onset and raced to 15 off 12 balls before his captain could face a delivery.

Rahul was middling the ball beautifully and played the role of the aggressor, while Rohit was happy to bide his time in the middle giving India a sedate and sensible start.

There was a brief lull in the middle with 23 balls without a boundary before Rohit suddenly switched gears just before the halfway mark.

Scoring just 16 off 18 balls,

Rohit decided to take on left-arm spinner Mitchell Santner and hit him for two sixes in the mid-wicket and long-on region in an over that yielded 16 runs.

JAMMU: The National and International Footballers' Forum (NIFF) today alleged inclusion of outside J&K girls by the J&K Football Association (JKFA) in the Union Territory team for the upcoming National Senior Women's Football Championship starting from November 28 at Kozhikode, Kannur and Malappuram in South Indian state of Kerala.

"It has come to our notice that one of the female coaches, who work outside J&K, has invited girls from Haryana to be part of the J&K senior team. This has been with the consent of JKFA without looking at the future of our own players.

Already lacking in encouragement, such acts on part of the JKFA further demoralise the women footballers in J&K," said advisor of NIFF and veteran footballer, Ramesh

Chander in a statement issued here.

"We are going to take this issue with the higher authority in the sports administration of J&K and will not allow anybody to spoil the future of local budding talent," added Ramesh.

The league-cum-knockout National event will feature 32 teams divided into eight groups with the winner of each group moving to the quarterfinals which will mark the start of the knockout stage.

Matches are scheduled to be held at four venues of Municipal Stadium (Kuthuparamba in Kannur), EMS Corporation Stadium and Calicut Medical College (both Kozhikode) and Calicut University stadium (Thenipalam in Malappuram) while EMS Corporation Stadium shall also host the semifinals and final.

## Decision to repeal farm laws most unfortunate: KPC

President KPC further said that the wrong decision seems to have been taken under compelling situation and will definitely have a negative effect on other tough decisions taken by present dispensation besides sending a wrong

signal to enemies of the nation and anti-nationalists. The decision will also demoralize all those nationalists who were supporting these farm laws passed by the Parliament of India after observing proper process, he added. He further said that Kashmiri Pandit Conference (KPC) and other like-minded nationalist organisations and people are not supporting this decision of the Government and urged the Prime Minister to re-think over the matter before repealing of farm laws in the interest of nation.

## Farms laws repealed in view of upcoming Assembly polls: Hari Singh

JAMMU: After Prime Minister Narendra Modi's announcement repealing three farm laws, District Congress Committee (DCC) President, Hari Singh Chib said that the decision has been taken in view of the upcoming Assembly polls in five states early next year. He termed Centre's announcement as "victory of Samyukta Kisan Morcha's year-old struggle."

Speaking on the sidelines of a function held here in connection with the birth anniversary of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi organised by DCC Rural Jammu today, the senior Congress leader said that after one year, Prime Minister Narendra Modi came to know that people are not accepting this law.

"This is the victory of the bravery with which the Samyukta Kisan Morcha fought for one year against these laws. More than 750 farmers were martyred and PM did not speak a word about this martyrdom," he said.

For the last more than one year, Centre kept

on saying that the agriculture laws would not be withdrawn, but now the government withdrew them keeping the Assembly elections in mind," Chib said. Chib further termed the Centre's decision to withdraw the three farm laws as the historic victory of farmers who had been agitating for the past one year. "Today, the Prime Minister has to understand that this historic victory belongs to our Annadatas. Our farmers and those who have struggled till date, they have never turned back or looked back so we salute our farmers for this bravery to achieve such a historic victory." "Now with the withdrawal of the three farm laws, farmers are demanding that they should get the legal right to sell the agricultural product at MSP. That right will have to be implemented legally in Parliament," he added.

Hari Singh Chib appealed to the Prime Minister and Union Agriculture Minister to fix the MSP after consulting the farmers, without any further delay.

## Withdrawal of cases, relief to NoKs of deceased farmers should follow farm laws' repeal: Bunty

JAMMU: Chairman, Sikhs for Humanity Foundation (SHF), Surinder Singh Bunty on Friday demanded that repeal of three 'draconian' farm laws should be followed by dropping of baseless cases lodged against farmers over 26th January 'episode' and adequate compensation to NoKs of deceased farmers who lost their lives for the cause of tilling community.

Addressing a presser here, the representative of aforesaid social organization hailed Government of India for decision to rectify the colossal mistake committed by those at the helm by bringing a legislation which

was prima facie anti-farmer and anti-people, and was bountiful for a selected few. He however lauded PM Narendra Modi for gauging the situation well in time because delay taking decision regarding repeal of these 'black' farm laws could have proved detrimental to ruling party especially in coming elections in UP and Punjab. He said that the adage 'Der Aaye Durust Aaye' well suits to BJP leadership in the matter, though countrymen are aware of the fact that the decision has come just before elections just to trim the damage which is impending. He said that the announcement by PM Modi

made it clear that the government has admitted its mistake and now it should compensate those families which saw deaths and destruction due to agitation against farm laws, which were forced upon them by the Government. Bunty said that ruling party gave a political tinge to this issue to get electoral mileage but the things boomeranged and the outcome is before people and the aforesaid party has to backpedal. "This surely is the defeat of anti-people forces and triumph of real India," he maintained adding that government should not shirk in apologizing from common masses as yearlong farmers' agitation witnessed so many lows as far as 'biased media' and lopsided political class are concerned, for which Government is solely responsible. He also demanded that without wasting even a jiffy, the Government should agree in principle to bring legislation on Minimum Support Price (MSP) as same is necessary for providing justice to farmer fraternity of country.
