

Stop online shopping, stimulate businesses of local traders: CCI

JAMMU: The Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCI) Jammu on Monday asked the people to avoid online shopping to give a boost to local business to support traders in the region as business has been affected badly due to coronavirus and law and order situation in the UT.

This was stated by Arun Gupta President CCI Jammu while addressing a meeting of Chamber office bearers at Chamber House Jammu. He said saving local traders from devastation is also the responsibility of the people of the region therefore it is


advisable that people should buy goods from local shops. He said that online shopping is not the alternative to local shops and if the trend will continue the days are not far when local shops will disappear leading to inconvenience to the public and livelihood loss to traders.

Gupta appealed to the

people of Jammu in general not to discourage the local vendors as it has been observed many times products are much cheaper than the online shopping sites. Gupta also took up a significant issue of administration harassing the traders on petty issues during peak festive season. He said that government

should understand the fact that already businessmen are facing lots of problems due to coronavirus, etc and harassing them in the name of petty rules like showcasing goods outside shops etc is totally unjustified and therefore government should take a considerate view by allowing such minor alterations during the peak of business season.

Gupta said that still the threat of coronavirus is looming large therefore it is advisable that people should follow SOPs invariably without any carelessness. He said that CCI Jammu is standing shoulder to shoulder with the people of Jammu region especially the traders fraternity and assured that the Chamber will continue to serve the people with strong resolve.

Rs 31.89 cr World Bank funded IRUP to strengthen road connectivity in North Kashmir

JAMMU: Rs 31.89 crores are being spent on the strengthening of the inter-district road connectivity between Baramulla and Bandipora districts in North Kashmir under the World Bank funded Jhelum Tawi Flood Recovery Project (JTFRP).

The Integrated Road Upgradation Project (IRUP) being executed under the component - Reconstruction of Roads and Bridges of JTFRP involves the upgradation of 12.68 km Hamrey-Sultangpora-Nowgam, 6 km Shadipora-Khanipeth Sumbal road (District Baramulla/Bandipora) and 7.186 km Hajin-Ajas via Saidnura (District Bandipora).

The work on the road upgradation project is being executed by J&K Economic Reconstruction Agency and as part of the routine monitoring of the works, Er. Shakti Sagar, Director, Kashmir, JKERA today inspected work on the road upgradation project.

Er. Syed Zahoor Hussain, Project Manager, Transport, J&KERA, Kashmir while giving details of the project on Monday informed that work on the integrated road upgradation project includes upgradation of road from single lane to the intermediate lane configuration in (Shadipora-Khanipeth-Sumbal) and (Hajin-Ajas) and strengthening of existing Hamrey-Sultangpora-Nowgam road.

The integrated road upgradation project will benefit around 1.5 lac souls living in the more than 30 villages along both the sides of the road and will provide them with all-weather road connectivity with improved riding surface and improved access to market for their agricultural produce and better access to health, education etc.

The villages to be benefited include Koshum Bagh, Rakhi Hajin, Sadrukote, Sadunara, Gund Prang, Ajas, Hamray, Trambgund, Rakhi Hygam, Wussan, Gund Jehangir, Sadatpora, Sumbal, Tangapora, Bulagam, Shadipora, Rakhi Shilpat, Nain, Tigran, Gund Khalil, Parihaspora, Turgam, Khanipeth etc.

CBSE, SCERT to collaborate on NAS; survey to be held across India

SRINAGAR: The Central Board of School Education (CBSE) and State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT), Jammu and Kashmir, are all set to collaborate on conducting a sample based National Achievement Survey (NAS) for classes 3, 5, 8 and 10 in the Union Territory on November 12.

The CBSE will conduct the survey on behalf of the Education Ministry in all 733 districts across the country.

Pertinently, the survey is a competency based national-level large scale assessment conducted with an aim of providing information about the learning achievement of students to have a system level reflection on effectiveness of school education in the country.

Giving details, Director SCERT, Professor Veena Pandita, on Monday said the survey will aid educational planners, policy makers and researchers in understanding the interdependence of assessment, pedagogical process and learning outcome in improving the quality of education.

She said the prolonged school closure in the wake of Covid-19 pandemic has affected students' learning in terms of their socio-emotional and cognitive development in more ways than one.

"NAS 2021 will help us in systematic understanding of the consequences that prolonged closure of schools has had on students' learning," Prof Pandita maintained. She said that results will help us to make out the students' performance in different learning outcomes vis-à-vis the contextual variables.

SCERT has issued a string of instructions in this regard to hold the survey in a methodical manner. The heads of District Institutes of Education and Trainings (DIETs) have been nominated as district nodal officers (DNOs) who, in turn, have

Private Security Guards at J&K Bank hold protest against salary cuts

JAMMU: Hundreds of security guards, including ex-servicemen, working for a private company engaged by a bank, on Monday staged a protest here against alleged salary cuts without any notification.

The guards providing protection to Automatic Teller Machines (ATMs), cash vans and bank branches assembled outside the zonal office of J&K Bank at Bahu Plaza and staged a sit-in, seeking intervention of Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha and the bank management to ensure proper wages to them.

"We have assembled here to lodge our protest against the salary cut at a time when the prices of essential commodities, including kitchen goods, apart from petrol and diesel, have skyrocketed making the lives of the common man miserable," ex-paramilitary serviceman Balbir Singh, who was leading the protest, said.

Singh, who is posted as a security guard in the zonal office, said the salary cut of nearly Rs 2,000 to Rs 2,500 to both unskilled and skilled guards was not acceptable to them.

Pertinently, the SCERT conducted a survey of classes 3, 5 and 8 on September 30 aimed at identifying gaps in the students' learning caused due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

"The survey, which was conducted across all the districts of J&K UT, has acted as a dress-rehearsal for the ensuing NAS," the official said. He added that since the survey was conducted on similar lines as laid out in the NAS, the task ahead has relatively been made easy.

He further informed that the SCERT distributed unused question booklets of the survey among the students from time to time to familiarise the students with the assessment format.

The last NAS was held in 2017/2018 for assessing the competencies of children at the grade levels 3, 5, 8 and 10, however, the next round scheduled in 2020 could not be held due to the school closures in the wake of Corona Virus.

The concerned officers apprised the Deputy

He demanded a monthly salary of Rs 15,000 for ex-servicemen working as guards providing security to bank branches and cash vans and Rs 10,000 for ATM guards who work from 5 am to 10 pm daily.

"The contractor changes every three years and this time a Chandigarh-based company has got the contract. They have shown insensitivity and left thousands of guards, who are risking their lives, distressed," he said, requesting the intervention of the bank management and the LG in reversing the pay cut and also ensuring proper wages to them.

Later, a delegation of the protesters met the bank officials and the protest was ended on their assurance that they will take up the issue with the company concerned.

TNWS seeks LG's intervention for slashing rates of Freehold Rights

JAMMU: To discuss the issue regarding slashing rates of Freehold Rights for residents of Trikuta Nagar colony, an urgent meeting of executive members of Trikuta Nagar Welfare Society (TNWS) was held on Monday under chairmanship of its President, Rajinder Parshad Kakkar, which was attended by a number of members and residents of colony.

Dr Mehta directed the department to prepare a framework for assessing the competency of the teachers based on the achievement of learning outcomes by the students during the year so that capacity building of teachers, wherever necessary, is also made a part of overall focussed policy action in the education sector.

While directing the department to take steps to increase the enrolment ratio in the schools, he advised the department that increase in drop out ratio beyond an acceptable level in a given school should be made an area of responsibility of the teachers in that school and accountability of the teachers fixed in case the enrolment declines below the acceptable level.

Stating that virtual / online teaching has been a great enabler during the Covid times, the Chief Secretary directed the Education department to explore the feasibility of building capacities towards virtual /online learning in all schools, besides emphasising that the department should also increase the sweep and spread of the vocational education in J&K.

While reviewing the educational indicators in J&K, the Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Mehta observed that there is a very significant drop in the gross enrolment ratio and net enrolment ratio from primary to upper primary level.

"Every fifth students seems to be dropping out at the time of moving from primary to upper primary school. This calls for a concerted action from the depart-
