

Congress Refugee Cell holds protest against entry fee of Rs 25 at Flower Garden

JAMMU: Congress Refugee Cell Vice Chairman and Block President Amrit Bali on Sunday led a strong protest against J&K Administration for charging an entry fee of Rs 25 for every individual for visiting Flower Garden, located at Bhour Camp in Jammu. He further said that the garden was inaugurated by former MLA Gandhi Nagar, Raman Bhalla, on March 31, 2008, with a hope that it would become a major tourist destination of the region, but BJP Govt failed to take proper care of it. "The garden, which was raised after spending crores on 563 Kanals of land, at the pattern of famous Tulip Garden in Kashmir valley, is still waiting for tourists and required promotions. The hopes with which the garden was inaugurated to promote tourism in Jammu completely died because the concerned authorities seem to

be least bothered about its maintenance, completing work and attracting tourists. It is really a matter of grave concern that even after passage of 12 years, flower garden is nowhere in any map or any promotional event. Instead of developing flower garden, with every passing year, poor planning and lack of will on part of BJP Govt led to its further downfall. It is unfortunate that on one hand Government claims to promote and boost tourism sector and on the other hand

such gardens and other places of interest are being neglected," he added.

The Vice Chairman of Congress Refugee Cell further said that it is high time that concerned authorities should come forward to promote the garden as it has a potential to attract tourists thereby besides boosting the economy considerably. "As, tourist season is about to begin, I will like to request the concerned authorities to pay due attention towards it besides opening it for tourists," said Bali. He fur-

ther drew the attention of concerned authorities towards damaged portion of bridge and approach road and requested for immediate repair works to avoid any untoward incident. "Negligence of Public Works (Road & Building) Department can be gauged from fact that a vital bridge at Ward No-2 of Bhour Camp Chatha, which connects several villages, is lying damaged for years and concerned department is least considerate to repair the same thereby putting locals in great distress, as five persons have already lost their lives. Around 3-4 villages are benefitted with the bridge but due to damage, vehicular movement is not possible on it due to which people have to adopt long routes," he said, alleging that a number of representations were presented to the concerned department, but nothing was done to mitigate sufferings of people.

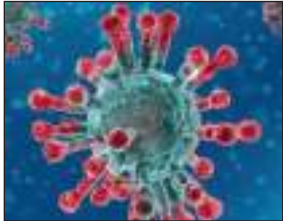
Speaking on the occasion, Dr Thappa said that dressings vary greatly in nature and size, so it is important to select the correct dressing for use on a specific wound. A sterile dressing which is past its expiry date should Not be used, he said.

He said that a bandage is used in combination with a dressing where a wound is present. A roller bandage is used to secure a dressing in place. A triangular bandage is used as an arm sling or as a pad to control bleeding. It may also be used to support or immobilise an injury to a bone or joint or as improvised padding over a painful injury. A tubular gauze bandage is used to retain a dressing on a finger or toe.

Active COVID-19 cases in country decline to 1,22,714

NEW DELHI: India logged 10,488 new coronavirus infections taking the country's total tally of COVID-19 cases to 3,45,10,413, while



the active cases declined to 1,22,714, the lowest in 532 days, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Sunday.

The death toll climbed to 4,65,662 with 313 fresh fatalities, according to the data updated at 8 am.

The daily rise in new coronavirus infections has been below 20,000 for 44 straight days and less than 50,000 daily new cases have been reported for 147 consecutive days now.

The active cases comprise 0.36 per cent of the total infections, the lowest since March 2020, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate was recorded at 98.30 per cent, the highest since March 2020, the ministry said.

A decrease of 2,154 cases has been recorded in the active COVID-19 caseload in a span of 24 hours.

India's COVID-19 tally had crossed the 20-lakh mark on August 7, 2020, 30 lakh on August 23, 40 lakh on September 5 and 50 lakh on September 16. It went past 60 lakh on September 28, 70 lakh on October 11, crossed 80 lakh on October 29, 90 lakh on November 20 and surpassed the one-crore mark on December 19.

India crossed the grim milestone of two crore on May 4 and three crore on June 23.

MUMBAI: Taking a dig at China, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh on Sunday said "some irresponsible nations" with their narrow partisan interests and hegemonic tendencies are coming up with wrong definitions of the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea (UNCLOS).

It is a matter of concern that UNCLOS is being repeatedly weakened by arbitrary interpretation of its definition by some nations, Singh said, after commissioning of Indian Navy's destroyer Visakhapatnam here.

"Some irresponsible nations, with their narrow partisan interests, hegemonic tendencies are coming with wrong definitions of international laws," Singh said. Indigenously-built stealth guided missile destroyer Visakhapatnam, packed with an array of missiles and anti-submarine rockets, was commissioned in presence of top naval commanders.

He also motivated the students about answer writing practice on regular basis and suggested to attend atleast one comprehensive test series before the Mains exam.
