# CRIME REPORT

## Three drug peddlers arrested, contraband recovered

### ■ STATE TIMES NEWS

SRINAGAR: Police in a series of actions across Kashmir valley has arrested three drug peddlers in Anantnag and Baramulla. Huge cache of contraband substance has been recovered from their possession.

In Anantnag, officers from Police Station Bijbehara at a checkpoint arrested three drug peddlers identified as Mehraj Ahmad Sheikh, son of Mohd Ismail, resident of Dalgate Srinagar, Mohd Altaf Baluki, son of Abdul Rashid, resident of Ranawari Srinagar and Rayees Ahmad Lone, son of Abdul Salam, resident of Prichal Pulwama. Officers also recovered 12Kg Charas powder from their possession. The accused were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. A case under relevant sections of law was registered at PS Bijbehara and investigation initiated.

In Baramulla, during routine patrolling at Yadipora Pattan, a police party led by Incharge Police Post Pallahall under supervision of SDPO Pattan Mohammad Nawaz Khanday, arrested a drug peddler identified as Laldin Poswal, son of Siraj-ud-Din Poswal, resident of Warnow Lolab, Kupwara and recovered 16 strips (172-tablets) of a banned drug from his possession. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained under custody. A case under relevant section of law was registered at Police Station Pattan and further investigation is under progress.

## Rs 21,700 fine recovered from SoPs violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Tuesday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 21,700 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 67,03,200.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 1,114 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Tuesday. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1,661 samples including 353 RT-PCR and 1,308 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 1,114 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

## 50-Kanals state land retrieved in Gandoh

DODA: Fifty Kanals encroached Government land was retrieved on Tuesday in village Kandoloo by a team of revenue officials headed by Naib Tehsildar Gandoh. According to Tehsildar Bhalessa, Irshad Ahmed Sheikh, the anti-encroachment drive was conducted in continuation to massive drive initiated by District Administration Doda to vacate encroached government land. He further said that as per directions of District Magistrate, Vikas Sharma, 'the drive against encroachers will continue till the entire encroached land in the areas is recovered.'

## Two bootleggers arrested; 125 bottles of illicit liquor seized

KHOUR: Police on Tuesday arrested two bootleggers and seized 125 quarters of illicit liquor from their possession.

As per details, during Naka at TCP Pallanwalla, a police team led by In-charge Phalanwala PSI Vijay intercepted a man coming carrying one bag in his hand who on noticing police party tried to change his way. He was apprehended and during search of bag, 60 quarters of illicit whiskey (180 ml each) were recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Sita Ram, son of Bachan Lal, resident of Samwan Tehsil Khour was arrested and a case under relevant section of law was registered against him.

In another incident, during checking at Baldev Chowk under the supervision of SHO Khour Balwinder Singh, Khour Police apprehended a person carrying 65

quarters of illicit whiskey (180 ml). The accused was identified as Prakash, son of Chatter Singh, resident of Amritsar (Punjab), presently staying at Khour. He was arrested and FIR under relevant section of law was registered against him.

## Theft case solved; 3 arrested, stolen medicines worth thousands recovered

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday solved a theft case by arresting three persons and recovered stolen medicines worth Rs 80,000.

As per details, a written complaint was lodged at Police Station City by Suraj Kumar, son of Late Om Parkash, resident of Kote Mora, Badhani Tehsil Bhalwal stating that on November 22, 2021 some unknown thieves struck his shop namely M/s K S Pharma wholesale Pharmaceutical distributors at R N Pura Jammu and decamped with medicines worth Rs 80,000. On this, FIR No. 74/2021 under section 379 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this police team of Police Station City under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu led by SHO City Inspr Vijay Kumar did strenuous efforts and with the help of CCTV footages of area finally rounded up three suspects namely Rahul Sharma, son of Kewal Krishan; Anurag Sharma, son of Late Ashwani Sharma and Akhil Sharma, son of Raj Kumar, resident of Ratnal Tehsil Bishnah.

During sustained questioning, accused confessed their involvement in the theft case and on their disclosure stolen medicines were recovered from a vehicle (JK02BH 9497). The vehicle was also seized by the police. Further investigation of the case is going on.

## Two Govt teachers terminated for unauthorised absence

SRINAGAR: Jammu & Kashmir Government on Tuesday ordered termination of two more teachers from Government services for remaining unauthorizedly absent for a period of more than five years.

As per an order, two teachers were terminated from their services under Article 113 of J&K Civil Service Rules (Volume I) of 1956. The teachers, who were terminated from their service included Jameela Akhtar Teacher BHS Singhpora of Anantnag and Nighat Hussain, Teacher BMS Soura of Srinagar.

Meanwhile, as per termination order Jameela Akhtar has been terminated from her services for remaining absent from her legitimate duties from September 9, 2014. Similarly, the termination order of Nighat Akhtar stated that she was absent from her legitimate duties from September 1, 2012, even after she was provided ample opportunities to resume duties. Notably, on November 21, Government terminated four teachers from the services for remaining absent for more than 5 years from their legitimate duties.

## Sericulture employee among two die under mysterious circumstances

UDHAMPUR/JAMMU: A sericulture employee among two died under mysterious circumstances on Tuesday.

As per details, one Ramesh Kumar, posted in Sericulture Deptt at Power House area of Udhampur; deployed at night duty, was found dead in office premises. His body was shifted to morgue for autopsy. Police has registered a case under section 174 of CrPC.

Meanwhile, Satya Devi, wife of Vinod, resident of Firozabad, presently staying at Purkhoo camp succumbed to injuries at hospital. She got injured on Nov 21 during work at Mishriwala and was under treatment at hospital.

## Man found dead in Kokernag

ANANTNAG: Police on Tuesday found a man dead in fields at Kokernag area of Anantnag district. As per details, Ghulam Mohammad Wagay, son of Mohammad Shaban Wagay of Shangran Dooru was dead found by some locals at Voi Bemdoora village. Subsequently, they informed the concerned police station, from where a team

rushed to the spot and shifted body to morgue.

## Scooty rider dies in mishap

As per details, Satinder Pal Singh, son of Gyan Singh, resident of Ajit Colony, Camp Gol Gujral, who was riding a scooty, got hit by an unknown vehicle due to which he got injured. He was shifted to hospital where he succumbed to injuries. Police has registered a case and started investigation.

## Man attempts suicide

He had suffered 65 per cent burns and died in hospital eight days later.

## Beggars create ruckus at B C road, attack passers-by
