Speaking on the occasion, the councilors said that the way JMC is destroying shops these days and harassing traders by putting yellow lines in front of their shops besides intimidating shopkeepers by calling their establishments illegal in the city, is simply unacceptable and we oppose the same because if these shops are illegal, then why

action was not initiated at the time when they were being constructed. "Corporation should take action on the officers who were posted there at that time and now when these shopkeepers have been running shops for years, the corporation is hell bent to initiate demolition drive thereby causing damage of lakhs," said protestors, questioning why Mayor and Deputy Mayor are silent over the issue and why such illegal actions are not being

stopped. "If there is nothing in their control, they should resign from their posts. BJP J&K President Ravindra Raina should answer to people of Jammu whether these are the 'Achey Din' as promised by party before elections," they said, adding, "We will not accept this hooliganism of the corporation under any circumstances and to end it, it is necessary to have a house of the corporation, which is deliberately ignored by the Mayor."
