As per report reaching here, Kerala won the toss and elected to bat.

Batting first, Kerala was bundled out for a paltry total of 128 runs in 34.3 overs. Ananthakrishnan J top scored 35 runs off 42 balls, while Sachin Suresh, Alfi and Akshay contributed 21, 19 and 18 runs to the total respectively.

In reply, J&K chased the target in 37.4 overs, losing 6 wickets in the process, thus won the match by 4 wickets.

Wicket-keeper/batsman Kanhaiya Wadhawan, who played a valuable unbeaten innings of 40 odd runs in
