Police seizes heroin worth Rs 100 Cr from truck in Jammu; 1 held

JAMMU: Police on Thursday seized 52 kilogram of heroin worth Rs 100 crore from a Punjab-bound truck and arrested one person here, a senior police official said.

Initial investigation suggests that the narcotics was smuggled into Jammu and Kashmir from Pakistan to fund terrorism in the Valley, police said.

"On a specific information, station house officer (SHO) of Jhajar Kotli Devender Singh set up checkpoints for the search of vehicles on a highway." Additional Director General of Police (ADGP), Jammu zone, Mukesh Singh told reporters at a press conference.

Jammu and Kashmir Director General of Police (DGP) Dilbag Singh was also present.

Mukesh Singh said a truck on its way to Punjab from Srinagar jumped a checkpoint and tried to sped away

Some people looking at killers as innocent: DGP

JAMMU: The Director General of Jammu and Kashmir Police, Dilbag Singh on Thursday said that some people are looking at the killers as innocent people.

While responding to a question about Mehbooba Mufti's aspersions about Rambagh encounter, Singh during a press conference at Jammu said that some people deliberately try to ignore the reality and give statements which are far from reality and these people have started to look at the killers as innocent people.

According to Srinagar based news agency, Kashmir News Service (KNS), Singh, while replying to a question regarding Hyderpora encounter, said that there is no doubt that some civilians were killed during the encounter but after that dozens of successful anti-terrorism

was intercepted. During the search of the truck, police seized 52 kilogram of heroin worth Rs 100 crore in the international market, he said.

However, the driver of the truck managed to escape, the police official said. But co-driver, identified as Bharat Kumar of Haryana, was arrested, he added.

During initial investigation, it came to the fore that the consignment of heroin was being smuggled to Punjab from Srinagar in Kashmir, the ADGP said.

Pockets containing heroin have 1999 markings, which points towards its smuggling into J-K from Pakistan to fund terrorism, he said. Earlier seizures of heroin had similar markings as well, he added.

Giving further information, Mukesh Singh said police have seized 185 kilogram of heroin worth Rs 360 crore in the past two years in

Rambagh encounter Mobile internet suspended

SRINAGAR: Most of the shops in the Downtown area of Srinagar were shut on Thursday while mobile internet remained suspended in many parts of the city a day after the killing of three militants, including the self-styled commander of The Resistance Front (TRF), in an encounter, officials said.

They said the areas where the shutdown was observed included Nowhatta, Gojwara, Khanyar, Safakadal, Nawakadal, Rajouri Kadal and MR Gunj in the interior areas of Srinagar. However, traffic was plying normally,

NIA carries out searches in Al-Qaeda related case in Kashmir

SRINAGAR: The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Thursday carried out searches at five locations in Kashmir in connection with its investigation into a case related to an Al-Qaeda group's planning to launch terror attacks in India, an official said.

The case was initially registered in Lucknow by Uttar Pradesh's Anti-Terrorist Squad (ATS) on July 7 and subsequently taken over by the NIA for an in-depth investigation on July 29, a spokesperson of the agency said.



The NIA said the raids were carried out at five locations in south Kashmir's Shopian district and central Kashmir's Budgam district. A large number of incriminating documents and digital devices were seized, it added. The case pertains to Umar Halmandi, an Al-Qaeda operative, who along

Active COVID cases in country lowest in 539 days

NEW DELHI: India logged 9,119 new coronavirus infections taking the country's total tally of COVID-19 cases to 3,45,44,882, while the active cases declined to 1,09,940, the lowest in 539 days, according to the Union Health Ministry data updated on Thursday.

The death toll climbed to 4,66,980 with 396 fresh fatalities, including 308 from Kerala, according to the data updated at 8 am.

The daily rise in new coronavirus infections has been below 20,000 for 48 straight days and less than 50,000 daily new cases have been reported for 151 consecutive days now.

The active cases comprise 0.32 per cent of the total infections, the lowest since March 2020, while the national COVID-19 recovery rate was recorded at 98.33 per cent, the highest since March 2020, the

JAMMU: In a significant order, a Division Bench of High Court of Jammu and Kashmir & Ladakh (Jammu Wing) comprising Justice Dhiraj Singh Thakur and Justice Mohd Akram Chowdhary directed AAG Aseem Sawhney, appearing for Govt of J&K to provide all details of politicians /ex-Legislators who are ordinarily residents of Jammu province and other areas in and around Jammu District, and possess accommodation in their names or have been furnished Govt accommoda-

tion on so called security considerations, not only in Jammu but even in Srinagar. When this much publicized PIL No. 17/2020 highlighting illegal occupation of Ministerial Bungalows/ A-Type Kothis/ flats/ quarters situated at Jammu / Srinagar came up for hearing, Advocate Sheikh Shakeel Ahmed with Advocates Supriya Chouhan, Mohd Zulkarnain Choudhary and Majid Shah appearing for petitioner submitted that since June 2018, Ex- Ministers/ Ex-Legislators/ Political workers

In a letter address to additional chief secretary/principal secretary/secretary (Health) of all states and union territories, Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan asked them to ensure that samples of trav-

ellers turning positive are sent to designated genome

J&K reports 182 new COVID cases, Ladakh 28

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Thursday recorded 182 new cases of coronavirus, taking the infection tally to 3,36,063 while no fresh death due to the virus was reported in the last 24 hours, officials said.

Of the new cases, 33 were reported from the Jammu division and 149 from the Kashmir division, they said. Srinagar district recorded the highest of 69 cases

JAMMU: In a much publicized Public Interest Litigations filed by Advocate Dewakar Sharma highlighting various issues involving the conserva-

tion/preservation of river Tawi, a Division Bench of State High Court comprising Chief Justice Pankaj Mithal and Justice Mohd Akram Chowdhary directed Inspector General of Police Jammu and Deputy

Commissioner Jammu to file status reports regarding extent of removal of encroachments and about the alleged illegal mining still being carried out from bed of River Tawi.

DB further directed Deputy Commissioner Jammu to inform the Court about the progress of work initiated for stopping flow of sewage water into river or regarding dumping of any waste

material into river. This significant direction has been passed when PIL came-up for hearing it has been informed that in pursuance to the directions of the court, some encroachments have already been removed from the River bank/bed but as per the reports on record still a vast area of land remains to be illegally occupied and the encroachers have not been removed.
