India's growth story being disrupted by forces with colonial mindset: PM

'Dynastic parties matter of concern to people committed to Constitution'

NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Friday said India's growth story is being disrupted by forces with a colonial mindset, including in the name of freedom of expression.

Addressing a Constitution Day event organised by the Supreme Court, he said a colonial mindset still exists, years after the end to colonialism, and these forces are putting obstacles in the path of growth of the developing nations.

"We are the only country that is in the process of achieving the goals of the Paris Agreement ahead of time and yet, in the name of environment, various pressures are being created in India. All this is the result of a colonial mindset," the prime minister said.

"But the unfortunate thing is that in our country too, due to such a mindset, obstacles are being put in the path of development, sometimes in the name of freedom of expression and sometimes

with the help of something else," he added.

The Constitution is the greatest strength to remove the obstacles being created by a colonial mindset, Modi said.

He said both the government and the judiciary are born out of the Constitution and hence, they are twins.

The government and the judiciary have come into existence only because of the Constitution, the prime minister said, adding that

J&K records 174 fresh COVID cases, 4 deaths

J&K ranks 3rd in farmer income ratings, 5th in agri-allied sectors: NITI Aayog

JAMMU: "Jammu and Kashmir has secured third place in all India ranking in terms of farmers' family earnings besides stepping up from rank 22 to 5 in agriculture and allied sector ranking within one year", as per the NITI Aayog's yearly survey.

This was stated by Principal Secretary, Animal and Sheep Husbandry & Fisheries departments, Navin Kumar Choudhary, while speaking at the National Milk Day celebration here on Friday.

The Principal Secretary, while addressing the dairy farmers and officers through

virtual mode, said that J&K will soon become milk surplus UT with excess milk production by 30 percent in 2022. 'The region will no longer be dependent on Punjab and Haryana for its milk requirement', he asserted.

Principal Secretary said that his department aims to boost production of processed milk products, in addition to milk, which would get a massive market with numerous upcoming retail chains in the UT as well as online portals. He urged upon the dairy farmers to get acquainted with digital platforms to capture major markets in future assuring digi-

tal marketing training to the willing among them.

Discussing potential markets for local milk producers, the Principal Secretary stressed on milk processing, value addition and export of such products. He informed that the government is providing a good subsidy to farmers for reaching markets all over India, as well as abroad in Dubai. 'It is high time that our Kalari reaches markets abroad', he said.

The Principal Secretary advised the milk producers to strictly adhere to the highest quality standards during milk production and processing. 'Only the best
