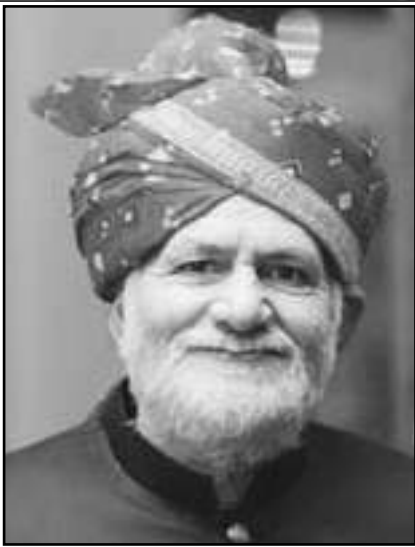

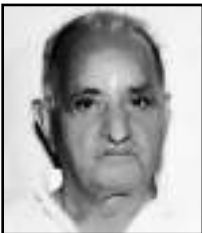

CRIME REPORT

2 drug peddlers arrested; huge quantity of contraband recovered

PULWAMA: Continuing its efforts to curb menace of drugs from the society, Police in a series of action has arrested 2 drug peddlers in Pulwama and recovered huge quantity of contraband substance from their possession.

As per details, officers from Police Station Pulwama during patrolling at Babagund intercepted a Maruti car bearing chasis No. 1964411 driven by one Parvaiz Ahmad Sheikh alias Mochi, son of Gh Qadir Sheikh, resident of Kangan Pulwama. During search, people recovered 15 bottles of Codeine, 16 Kg Bhang Patri and 100 gm Charas from his possession. He was arrested and vehicle used in the commission of crime was also been seized.

Meanwhile in another action, a party from Police Station Pulwama acting swiftly following a specific information about hoarding large quantity of contraband substances, conducted a raid at specific location in village Arigam Pulwama. During search, 15 Kg Bhang Patri was recovered from the house of one Mudasir Ahmad Dar, son of Ab Gani Dar, resident of Arigam, Pulwama. Hewas arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at Police Station Pulwama and investigation started.

Mobile public utility vehicle gutted

Excise sleuths destroy 42 lts illicit liquor, 3 working stills, 250 Kg Lahan; one arrested

RAJOURI: Excise Department arrested a person, destroyed 42 lts illicit liquor; 250 Kg Lahan and 3 working stills during different raids carried out to arrest menace of illicit distillation and sale of illicit liquor in Excise Range Rajouri Poonch.

On directions of Excise Commissioner, Kishore Singh Chib and supervision of Deputy Excise Commissioner (Executive), Jammu, Kusum Sharma, a team of Excise Range Rajouri Poonch led by inspector Mohd Arif and Mohd Farooq raided Barari, Nowshera and Hanjana and adjoining areas of District Rajouri to arrest menace of illicit distillation of liquor.

During the raid, a person was arrested with 3 bottles (750 ml each) of illicit liquor, identified as Mohan Singh, son of Partap Singh, resident of Barari, Nowshera. In the process, 40 lts illicit liquor and 250 Kg Lahan, raw material of illicit liquor were recovered by raiding team from state land & later destroyed on the spot.

Ramban Admn retrieves over 12,300 Kanals State land

RAMBAN: District Administration Ramban has retrieved over 12,300 Kanals State land and Roshni land during a massive anti-encroachment drive conducted across district Ramban. The drive was launched on November 15, 2021 on directions of the Deputy Commissioner Ramban, Mussarat Islam.

According to the Revenue department, 12,300 Kanals encroached land was retrieved including 283 Kanals in tehsil Ramsoo, 3,353 Kanals in Gool, 477 Kanals in Rajgarh, 922 Kanals in Banihal, 496 Kanals in Batote, 1,113 Kanals in Khari, 1,923 Kanals in Ukhral and 3,742 Kanals in tehsil Ramban. The drive has been intensified in all tehsils of district to remove all illegal encroachments as per rules.

Inter-state drug peddler arrested, over 19 Kg Ganja recovered

JAMMU: Police on Saturday apprehended a notorious inter-state drug peddler and recovered huge quantity of ganja from his possession.

As per details, during routine patrolling/Naka checking Opposite Lochan Nursing Home, Trikuta Nagar, a party from Police Station Trikuta Nagar led by ASI Manzoor Ahmed signaled a person to stop for checking, who



was coming on foot from Chhanni Himmat side. He was carrying red-coloured briefcase on his shoulder. Instead of stopping, he tried to run away which created suspicion. After a brief chase, he was over-powered by alert cops. On the search of his briefcase, 19 Kg 400 gm Ganja was recovered. On questioning, he disclosed his identity as Ranjeet Rajak, son of Bhirgu Nath Rajak, resident of village Ghartwalia, District Siwan, Bihar. FIR No. 379/21 under section 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Trikuta Nagar. Police team led by Insp Deepak Pathania SHO Trikuta Nagar and assisted by ASI Manzoor Ahmed made arrest/recovery under the supervision of Sajjad Sarwar SDPO City East, Deepak Digra SP South Jammu and overall supervision of SSP Jammu, Chandan Kohli.

70 Kg poppy straw recovered, 4 peddlers arrested

UDHAMPUR/BANIHAL: Continuing its drive against



drug peddlers and its propagators, police on Saturday apprehended four drug peddlers along with 70 Kg poppy straw. As per details, a team from Police Station Udhampur led by Insp Chaman Gorka SHO Udhampur under supervision of Anwaar-ul-Haq Addl SP Udhampur and Sahil Mahajan DySP Hqrs Udhampur laid a Naka at Jakhani Naka Point for checking of vehicles. During Naka checking, the police party intercepted a truck (PB0AS/0735) for thorough checking. During search of vehicle, 35 Kg poppy straw like substance was recovered by police. The accused driver identified as Nitish Koshal, son of Rakesh Kumar, resident of Hoshiarpur (Punjab) along with Paranjeet Singh, son of Ranveer Singh, resident of Hoshiarpur (Punjab) were arrested on the spot. FIR under relevant sections of law was registered against them at Police Station Udhampur.

Meanwhile, Banihal Police during routine checking at T Chowk Banihal intercepted a truck (PB31P-5715) for checking, which was on its way from Kashmir towards Jammu. During checking, 35 Kg poppy straw like substance was recovered from the truck. Both accused involved in the case, identified as Aman Kumar, son of Jeet Ram, resident of Kotewal Tehsil & District Jalandhar and Gurpreet Singh, son of Surinder Kumar, resident of Shaheed Baba Deep Singh Nagar, District Jalandhar were arrested and FIR No 207/2021 under sections 08/15/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Banihal. The

arrest as well as recovery was made by police party led by SHO Banihal Insp Nayeem Mattoo under the direct supervision of SDPO Banihal Ashish Gupta.

14 bovines rescued, vehicle seized

KATHUA: In its endeavours and commitment to contain activities of bovine smuggling in the district, a team of Police Station Rajbagh under the overall supervision of SSP R C Kotval foiled a bovine smuggling attempt near NH Rajbagh by rescuing 14 bovines. A vehicle was also seized by Police.

As per details, it was reliably learnt that a suspicious truck (JK02AP-1279), driven by an unknown driver, was on its way from Kathua towards Jammu in connection with smuggling of bovines. Acting swiftly, a police team led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh, while performing special Naka checking duty near NH Rajbagh, noticed aforementioned vehicle which was signaled to stop for checking. Sensing danger, driver of the vehicle managed to flee from the spot leaving behind the vehicle. During checking, 14 bovines were found laden insides the vehicle, which were rescued. In this regard, FIR No 244/2021 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Rajbagh Police Station and further investigation started.

Man dies in mishap, people's help sought for identification

Man shoots himself dead
