

Narco smuggler held with heroin**STATE TIMES NEWS**

POONCH: Police on Sunday nabbed a narco-smuggler with 10 gm heroin at Poonch. As per details, a party from Police Station Poonch led by SHO S D Singh Charak arrested a narcotic smuggler from Suka Katha and recovered 10 gm contraband heroin like substance from his possession. The accused was identified as Mohd Intiaz, son of Jamal Din, resident of Mohalla Saray, Poonch. FIR No 296/2021 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered against him in Police Station Poonch.

Blind Hit & Run case solved within 2 hours; accused arrested**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Police on Sunday solved a hit & run case within 2 hours by arresting accused. As per details, an information was received at Police station Bishnah from reliable sources that a van (JK 14B-1242) driven by an unknown driver coming from Jakh and going towards Nandpur, has hit a bike driven by one Sanjeev Kumar, son of Roop Lal, resident of Village Chakra Tehsil Bishnah, and injured the rider seriously. Some locals shifted the victim to a nearby hospital where he succumbed to injuries. On the information, FIR No. 170/2021 under sections 279/304-A of IPC was registered at Police Station Bishnah and investigation started. On this a team of Police Station Bishnah led by SHO Bishnah Insp. Joginder Singh under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Shabir Khan did strenuous efforts and with the help of analysis of CCTV footages of different locations along with technical assistance and timely human intervention, identified the driver of vehicle and arrested him. The accused driver was identified as Davinder Kumar Sharma, son of Kasturi Lal Sharma, resident of village Khour Salaria Tehsil Ramgarh and was arrested from Khour. The vehicle involved in the accident was also recovered and seized.

Drug peddler arrested with Ganja**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, police on Sunday nabbed a drug peddler and recovered 800 gm Ganja from his possession.

As per details, a team of Police Post Narwal led by SHO Bahu Fort Insp. Deepak Pathania assisted by Incharge Police Post Narwal PSI Sunil Singh under the supervision of SDPO City East Sajid Sarwar rounded up a suspect during Naka checking near Rajeev Nagar Chowk, who turned suspicious on seeing police. On search, 800 gm Ganja was recovered from possession of the suspect later identified as Sandeep Kumar, son of Madan Lal, resident of Rajeev Nagar. He was arrested and case under relevant sections was registered against him at Police Station Bahu Fort. The overall arrest and recovery was made under the supervision of SP City South Deepak Digras. Further investigation of the case is going on.

Abducted girl rescued**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JHAJ-JAR KOTLI: A minor girl, who was abducted a week ago, was rescued by Jhajjar Kotli police on Sunday and sent to a child welfare centre here, according to an official statement. As per details, on November 21, 2021, an information was received at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli regarding missing of a minor girl. On this, FIR no. 180/2021 under section 363 of IPC was registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and investigation was started.

After this special teams of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Parupkar Singh were constituted. The team led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Insp Devinder Singh assisted by PSI Mohd Saraz connected various leads and after hectic efforts and with support of technical assistance, recovered the kidnapped minor girl from accused. The girl was sent to Child Welfare Centre Trikuta Nagar Jammu and family of girl has been informed.

Missing two women among three traced; reunited with families**STATE TIMES NEWS**


JAMMU: Police on Sunday traced missing two women and a boy and handed them over to their families.

CRIME REPORT**Rs 23,400 fine recovered from SoPs violators in Ramban****STATE TIMES NEWS**

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Sunday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 23,400 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 68,03,300.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr. Suresh informed that as many as 829 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district on Sunday. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1,736 samples including 345 RT-PCR and 1,391 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 829 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

2 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered**STATE TIMES NEWS**

ANANTNAG: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from society, Police on Sunday arrested two drug peddlers in Anantnag and recovered contraband substance from their possession.

As per details, Police Station Bijbehara received information through reliable sources regarding drug dealings in premises of Sangam Roadway Transport Company located at Sangam. Accordingly, a party from Police Station Bijbehara led by SHO Bijbehara under supervision of SDPO Bijbehara along with Executive Magistrate raided the specific location. During search, 70 Kg poppy straw was recovered. One accused person namely Bashir Ahmed Reshi, son of Mohd Sultan Reshi, resident of Batpore Naina was arrested on the spot. However 2 other accused persons identified as Sajad Ahmad Bhat, son of Mohd Maqbool Bhat, resident of Waghama and Ab Hameed Mir, son of Abdul Raheem Mir, resident of Natipora Sangam managed to escape from the spot and efforts are on to effect their arrest. The arrested accused was shifted to police station where he remained in custody.

Meanwhile in another action, a police party of Police Station Anantnag established a checkpoint at Mehandi Kadai Anantnag and intercepted a suspicious person identified as Naseer Ahmad Khan, son of Hayat Khan resident of Haapnathar. During search, officers recovered 2.7 Kg Charas from his possession. He was arrested and shifted to Police Station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective Police Stations and investigations started.

4 arrested for illegal extraction & transportation of minerals**STATE TIMES NEWS**

BUDGAM: Police on Sunday arrested 4 persons and seized 4 vehicles involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals in Budgam.

As per details, officers from Police Station Chadoora arrested 4 persons involved in illegal extraction and transportation of clay from Government land at Kuzwera, Gowherpora Budgam. They also seized 4 vehicles including 3 tippers and a JCB from the spot. The arrested persons were identified as Mohammad Isaq Bhat, son of Ghulam Mohd Bhat, resident of Kuzwera; Mohammad Shafiq Rather, son of Ghulam Mohd Rather, resident of Doonewari and Mehraaj Din Dar, son of Abdul Gaffar Dar and Ishfaaq Ahmad Gourah, son of Mohammad Shabana, both residents of Maloura Khawaja Bazaar, Srinagar. They were shifted to Police Station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 198/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station

JAMMU: Police on Sunday busted a gang of two-wheeler lifters by arresting three accused persons.

As per details, Nowabad police during Naka at Dogra Chowk intercepted a scooter and asked riders to produce documents. On sensing trouble, both the scooter-borne youth tried to flee from the spot but were overpowered and detained by police. During questioning, they disclosed that they have stolen the scooter. They further said that they had also stolen many vehicles from various areas of city and sold the same in mountainous areas on cheaper rates. After their disclosure, a police team was sent to Doda who took back 10 stolen vehicles. Further investigation in the case is on and police is likely to arrest other members of gang.
