Subject:-Enforcement of manufacturing, sale & use of banned fire crackers and adherence to timing for bursting of permitted/improved/green crackers – Regarding.

PUBLIC NOTICE

In reference to J&K, State Pollution Control Board, Jammu's office communication No. JKPCC/LSJ/21/1936-1982 dated 30-10-2021 and this office order issued vide No. DCK/JC/2021/3206-31 dated 02-11-2021 on the occasion of Diwali and other festivals like Gurupurav, Christmas, New Year celebrations 2021 etc., the general public is hereby informed to adhere the below mentioned directions in letter & spirit during this festive season:-

a) Only green crackers are allowed for sale and use in District Kathua.
b) The fire crackers with harmful chemicals like Barium salts, Lithium, Mercury, Arsenic, Antimony are strictly banned for all practical purposes in this district. Further, sale and use of joint fire crackers (Laris etc.) is also completely banned.
c) The timings allowed for bursting of green/improved crackers on Diwali Days or any other festivals like Gurupurav etc. shall be from **08:00 PM to 10:00 PM** only. Further, on Christmas eve and New Year's eve, the use of such permitted fire crackers shall be allowed from **11:55 PM 12:30 AM** only.

Any violation of the above directions will invite legal action under Section 188 of the IPC and other provisions as applicable.
