

DC Kishtwar reviews arrangements for Urs Shah Asrar-ud-Din Sahib

KISHTWAR: Deputy Commissioner, Kishtwar, Ashok Sharma on Friday convened a meeting of all the concerned district officers to review the arrangements for Urs of Shah Asrar-Ud-Din Sahib (RA) scheduled on November 10, 2021.

During the meeting, the chair reviewed the different arrangements, including provision of accommodation for devotees, power supply/water supply, fire-wood, ration, LPG, Sanitation, Security, Medical care, transportation, fire tender and overall traffic management and passed a slew of directions to the concerned.

The DC directed XEN PHE Division Kishtwar to ensure availability of sufficient drinking water for devotees/Ziareens at the

shrines of Astan Bala, Astan Pani and other places from Nov 8 to Nov11, 2021 with backup provision of water tankers.

The Chief Executive Officer Kishtwar Development Authority and Executive Officer Municipality were also directed to go for repair and replacement of the non-functional street lights and high mast lights in the town and the adjoining areas of

the shrines and in the Chowgan ground for hassle free movement of devotees. Cleanliness around both the shrines and lime lining of the roads leading to the shrines was also stressed upon. Further, ARTO, DTL, SHO and manager bus stand were directed to devise a proper transport plan viz. arrangement of additional buses for smooth to and fro movement of pilgrims, management of Traffic and

Parking of vehicles. It was also revealed that for commercial vehicles ITI Ground and FCI Godown premises have been identified for parking. Executive Engineer JPDCL Kishtwar was directed to ensure uninterrupted Power Supply at both the shrines and places of stay of Ziareens.

The DC also directed CMO and MS District Hospital to establish one each first aid camp with all basic medical

facilities at both the shrines. He further directed for making available facemasks and sanitizers at both the places. Several other arrangements were also discussed in the meeting which included installation of temporary toilets, parking facility of passenger vehicles and establishment of control room.

It was also given out in the meeting that ACR Kishtwar shall be nodal officers for implementation of decisions and directions.

SSP Kishtwar Shafqat Hussain Butt; ACR Kishtwar Akhter Hussain Qazi; tehsildar (HQSTATE-TIMES NEWS) Chander Shekhar Sharma besides other concerned district and sectoral officers and Administrator Auqaf Islamia Kishtwar, besides prominent citizens also attended the meeting.

DC Poonch reviews progress of B2V3 works

POONCH: District Development Commissioner Poonch, Inder Jeet on Friday convened a meeting with officers to discuss the financial status of works approved under flagship B2V-3 programme.

During the meeting various issues related to B2V2 works were discussed in detail which includes completion of PMAY(Gramin) houses, status of MGNREGA works, completion of all pending works, and various

other issues related to development works.

The DDC sought in detail and updated figures block wise with regard to the estimation, tendering, allotment and completion of B2V-3 works, besides enquiring about issues if any hampering the execution of works.

It is informed in the meeting that a total of 825 works, including 526 of RDD, 13 of PWD, 237 of PDD, 27 of Jal Shakti and 22 of GWD and till now

819 have been tendered in which 580 have been allotted and 188 completed.

The Deputy Commissioner directed the BDOs to achieve the hundred percent targets within the stipulated time frame. He also directed the concerned executing agencies to complete all PMAY houses for homeless villagers by March 2022. He also directed to complete the tendering of B2V3 works and completion of the same within stipulated time frame.

The meeting was attended by Assistant Commissioner Panchayat, Shafiq Mir; AD Planning, M.A Khan; Xen PWD, Parwaiz Malik; Xen PDD, Irshad Hussain, all BDOs, AEE,s JEE,s besides other concerned officers were present.

DLIC clears 193 applications of Mumkin; 65 of Tejaswani

KATHUA: District Development Commissioner Kathua, Rahul Yadav on Friday chaired the meeting of District Level Implementation Committee (DLIC) to scrutinize the applications under Mumkin and Tejaswani schemes held here at DC office complex today.

The members of the DLIC Committee comprising General Manager DIC, ARTO Kathua and Lead Bank Manager Kathua after scrutiny of the applications of the aspirants dreaming to be self-employed, approved 193 fresh applications under Mumkin scheme thus taking the total tally of approvals to 339.

The first 65 applications of women specific scheme 'Tejaswani' were also approved by the committee who will get Rs 5 lakh loan to start a business unit

Pertinently, JKUT government has launched two schemes of 'Mumkin' and 'Tejaswani' under the Umbrella of 'Mission Youth' to extend hand holding to the unemployed youth so that they can become self reliant.

The DDC called upon the members to create adequate awareness about the scheme so that eligible candidates can avail the benefit of the scheme from all parts of the district.

Operational Casualty Certificate given to kin of BSF Martyr

RAMBAN: Deputy Commandant, Bhagwan Yadav on Friday gave away the operational casualty certificate to Hafiza Begum Wife of Lt Mohammed Iqbal resident of Perihender, Neel here on behalf of the Director General of Police, BSF.

Senior Superintendent of Police, Ramban, PD Nitya was also present.

Mohammed Iqbal was serving as a constable in 11 Battalion BSF when he was martyred in Bandipore in 2000 during counter insurgency operations. He was survived by his wife and five children.

The Dy. Commandant of STC BSF, Udhampur also requested the SSP Ramban to facilitate the BSF martyr families residing in district Ramban with any administrative help as and when required.

The family of Late Mohammed Iqbal welcomed the move of granting the operational casualty certificate by BSF as it would help them to avail various facilities from centre/state governments being the kin of the martyr. While interacting with the officers they were informed about details of facilities available in employment and business sectors, etc, which can be availed from operational casualty certificate.

DC Reasi reviews preparedness of health department to control Dengue

REASI: Deputy Commissioner Reasi Charandeep Singh on Friday chaired a meeting to review preparedness of the health department to control Dengue in the district.

The Deputy Commissioner directed the hospital authorities to keep the hospital premises clean.

Charandeep Singh asked the health department to ensure that no dengue patient undergoing the treatment may face any difficulty in the hospital. He also shared that there was no shortage of blood platelets and required medicines for dengue treatment in the hospital.

He emphasized that dengue and other vector-borne diseases can be controlled with

the cooperation of all other departments like PWD, Mines and Geology, Information, Transport, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Fisheries and Education Departments by working together.

The DC also asked the Food Safety Officers to conduct regular inspection of eateries in the city so that the people do not suffer on this account. He asked the

Chief Medical Officer to ensure that the Dengue patients get proper and immediate treatment in District Hospital Reasi.

Charandeep Singh further asked the health department to spread awareness regarding the preventive measures and provide best treatment to Dengue patients.

Chief Medical Officer Rajeev Sharma said that

out of 24 Dengue patients in the district reported till date, 18 have recovered and 06 are under treatment.

The DC asked for intensifying control measures including IEC activities specially in Katra, enhance testing, conduct regular fogging, DDT and Templos spray in the surrounding areas of the house of the Dengue positive patients, regular checking of Gambusia fishes and keep minimum five beds for Dengue patients.

Chief Medical officer, Rajeev Kumar Sharma; Medical Superintendent, Rajinder Kumar; District Health Officer S.D. Atri along with Medical Officers were present in the meeting.

JAMMU: Director of Agriculture, Jammu, K. K. Sharma on Friday underlined the need for mass promotion of Agriculture Mechanization for bringing about another agriculture revolution by enhancing production and productivity of food and non-food crops. He was addressing the officers and workers at Government Agriculture Workshop, Jammu during the celebration of Vishwakarma Day. A Puja congregation of Bhagwan Vishwakarma Puja was organised by Director AP & FW, Jammu and others at Seed Processing Unit, and Government Agriculture Workshop, Talab Tillo, Jammu.

Special worship of tools and machines with special prayers for safety of the operators and workers was done followed by distribution of Prasad. After the function, the Director along with a team of officers had a round of Seed Processing Unit where cleaning and grading of different seeds is being done by machines. Besides interacting with the workers of Government Agriculture Workshop, he also inspected the machines installed there like Sheet Cutting Machine, Sheet Bending Machine, Beading Machine, Power Hammers, Sheet Rolling Machines, Swaging machines etc. Vishwakarma Puja was also held at Seed Multiplication Farm Chinore and Seed Multiplication Farm Chakrohi.

Joint Director Agriculture (Inputs), Jammu, S. A. S. Reen, ARE, Kuldeep Dhar, Assistant Agriculture Engineer, A. H. Salaria, SMS III, Rajeev Mangotra and other senior officers and workers of the department also attended the programme.

Vector Control, IEC activities intensified to fight Dengue: Malariologist

JAMMU: The Malariologist, J&K, Jammu and civic bodies have intensified the preventive measures to control the rising cases of Dengue in Jammu Division.

Dengue is a viral disease caused by the bite of infected female aedes mosquito, which is highly domesticated voracious day biter and breeds in clean water, in and around the houses like old tyres, back yard litter etc.

A total of 1078 cases of Dengue have been reported in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir with majority of cases in districts of Jammu (659), Kathua (194) and Samba (94) in Jammu Division till 03.11.2021. The office of the Malariologist, J&K, Jammu has up scaled the ongoing activities like vector control activities (bio larvicide fish, spraying & fogging) and IEC/BCC activities(Print, Electronic, Social Media & milking).

On the spot visit are being conducted to the areas having a high number of reported cases, Radio talks to

increase the awareness among the masses regarding preventive measures is being aired periodically by the senior officers of the Department.

In collaboration with Jammu Municipal Corporation, thermal fogging has been conducted to kill adult mosquitoes two rounds (42 days) in a phased manner covering 75 wards of Jammu urban areas and additional rounds of fogging as per the NVBDCP guidelines. Similar activities are being carried out in the other districts like Samba, Kathua & Udhampur also.

Extra round of spraying was also done in collaboration with JMC. Indoor space spray and larvicide sprays are being done as per guidelines. Ten numbers of Sentinel Surveillance Hospitals with diagnostic facility are functional.

Keeping in view the upsurge of the cases, 155 numbers of beds have been dedicated for the hospitalised patients at GMC Jammu and all District Hospitals and new GMCs at Doda, Kathua and Rajouri.
