Civilian shot dead by terrorists in Srinagar 2 Lashkar ultras arrested in Valley

SRINAGAR: Terrorists on Monday shot dead a civilian in the Bohri Kadal area here, the second attack carried out by the ultras in the city in the past 24 hours, officials said.

Terrorists fired upon Mohammad Ibrahim Khan, a resident of Bandipora district, at Bohri Kadal around 8 pm, they said.

The officials said Khan was rushed to a hospital in a critical condition where he succumbed.

He worked as a salesman in the nearby Maharajgung, they said

The officials said security forces have cordoned off the area to trace the attackers.

Khan's killing was the second attack by the militants in the city in the past 24 hours. A policeman was shot dead in the Batamaloo area on Sunday evening.

National Conference leader Omar Abdullah condemned the killing of the civilian.

"The dastardly killing of Ibrahim is reprehensible & I unreservedly condemn it.



Unfortunately Ibrahim is the latest in a series of targeted killings in the valley, especially Srinagar. May Allah grant him place in Jannat," Omar tweeted.

The undersigned is directed to say that instructions regarding dealing with anonymous and pseudonymous complaints were issued vide this Department's Office Memorandum of even number dated 18.10.2013 proscribing that no action is required to be taken on anonymous complaints, irrespective of the nature of the allegations and that such complaints need to be simply filed. Subsequently, the said Office Memorandum has been clarified vide Office Memorandums of even number dated 18.06.2014 and 31.03.2015 in this regard, the Central Vigilance Commission's Circular No.07/11/2014 dated 25.11.2014 may so be referred to. A copy each of the DOP&T's aforesaid Office emorandums and CVC's Circular are enclosed herewith.

The instructions contained therein are retirenced and all Ministries/Departments are requested to follow the same while handling complaints received in their respective Ministry/Department.

Grievance Cell is ignoring these instructions Someone needs to look into the sordid affair to find out whether acting upon the anonymous complaints is because of ignorance or motivated by some other consideration, obviously with malafide intentions. After all, the fallout of the anonymous complaints is being borne out by the victim, who never knows why he had been framed and at whose behest. Some victims must be falling prey to blackmailers and extortionists. Truth must come to the fore and the 'dubious practice' of acting on 'anonymous complaints' needs to be halted in the larger public interest besides main taining the sanctity and credibility of the LG's Grievance Cell.
