

HC refuses to quash PSA of LeT OGW

JAMMU: Justice Dhiraj Singh Thakur of Jammu & Kashmir High Court dismissed the petition filed by Zahoor Ahmed Paray on over ground worker of LeT organization challenging his detention under PSA.

In Habeas Corpus petition, the petitioner challenges the order of detention dated 3.01.2020, passed by the District Magistrate, Bandipora, whereby in purported exercise of powers vested in him in terms of Clause (a) of Section 8 of the J&K Public Safety Act, 1978, he has directed detention of the petitioner with a view to prevent him from acting in any manner, which is prejudicial to the security of the State.

The basis of the order of detention as reflected in the grounds of detention are that the petitioner is an active over ground worker of LeT organization and

provides logistic support and shelter to the terrorists of the LeT organization. It is also alleged that the petitioner guides the active militants in Hajin area and has been orchestrating and organizing violent mobs for the enforcement of hartal calendar of the Hurriyat and thus acted against the sovereignty, integrity, peace and tranquility of the Union of India.

Not only this, the petitioner has been booked in a series of FIRs, namely, FIR No.15/2014 under Section 148, 149, 307, 353, 332, 336, 427 RPC with Police Station Hajin. It is alleged that the petitioner and his associates had taken out an unlawful procession from Hajin and had started pelting stones upon police/security personnel deployed for maintenance of law and order duty, with an intention to kill them and cause damage to Government/private

property. In the said incident, grievous injuries are stated to have been inflicted to the security and police personnel. The said FIR is stated to have been resulted in filing of a charge-sheet in the Court of competent jurisdiction. Justice Dhiraj Singh Thakur while dismissing the petition observed that on a perusal of the report, it can be seen that the petitioner was served with a copy of the order of detention, with the grounds of detention as also copies of the FIR. Not only this, the execution report also suggests that the documents were read-over and explained to the detenu in Urdu and Kashmiri languages, which the petitioner understood fully. Signatures were also obtained by the executing officer. On a perusal of the signatures, it can be seen that the petitioner has signed in the English lan-

CAT stays promotion of I/C AEEs

JAMMU: The Judicial Member of Central Administrative Tribunal Rakesh Sagar Jain after hearing after hearing Sr. Adv. Abhinav Sharma assisted by Advocate Abhimanyu Sharma stayed the Government order no. 155-JK (JSD) of 2021 whereby Govt private respondents have been promoted as Incharge Assistant Executive Engineers (Civil).

During the course of hearing Sr. Adv. Abhinav Sharma submitted that the applicants being aggrieved of the fact that the case of the applicants for their promotion as AEE (Civil) was rejected by virtue of Govt. Order No. 125-JK (JSD) of 2021 dated 11.06.2021 and further aggrieved of Govt. Order No. 127-JK

(JSD) of 2021 dated 14.06.2021, whereby and whereunder sanction was accorded to the placement of proforma respondents are Incharge Assistant Executive Engineer even when most of them were junior to the applicants and further aggrieved of the sanction accorded to the placement of the Incharge Assistant Engineers to the post of Incharge Assistant Executive Engineer despite the fact they being junior to the applicants, the applicants approached the Tribunal challenging the aforesaid orders by filing an Original Application bearing OA no. 61/1045/2021 titled "Rajesh Kumar Jain V/s UT of J&K & ors". That the matter was heard by the Hon'ble Tribunal and the Tribunal vide order

dated 22.07.2021 was pleased enough to pass the following directions that "Till then the respondents will not make any promotions to the post of Assistant Executive Engineer (A.E.E) in the concerned respondent department". The Tribunal by virtue of the interim order dated 22.07.2021 directed the respondents not to make any promotions to the post of Assistant Executive Engineers, yet the respondents in violation of the same passed another order bearing Govt. order No. 155-JK (JSD) of 2021 dated 03.08.2021 which is impugned herein, therefore, aggrieved of the order impugned the applicants are again constrained to approach this Tribunal seeking quashment of the same.
