## NGT appointed Joint Committee inspects Doodganga Nallah

SRINAGAR: The joint Committee constituted by National Green Tribunal(NGT), comprising of Deputy Commissioner Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz Asad, Deputy Commissioner, Budgam, Shahbaz Mirza, Director Urban Local Bodies, Mathura Masoom and Regional Director, Pollution Control Committee Kashmir, Rafi Ahmad Bhat, on Monday undertook a visit to Barzulla area to assess the water quality , quantity of sewage being discharged, solid waste being dumped on the banks of Doodganga river and to review the measures being taken for its cleanliness besides identification of the factors contributing to pollution of this river as per the directions of Hon'ble National Green Tribunal(NGT).

The inspection was carried in pursuance to the directions of National Green Tribunal(NGT) which, in a recent order in OA No. 241/2021, constituted a five-member Committee for submission of a factual report to the Tribunal in terms of taking remedial action for preventing discharge of sewage and dumping of solid waste on the banks of Doodganga River and Mamath Kull.

During the visit, the Committee directed the concerned officers to ensure cleaning and maintenance of the banks of Doodhganga

which is the source of irrigation as well as drinking water for a huge chunk of population of Srinagar and Budgam

The Committee also stressed upon the concerned field functionaries to sensitize people living near the banks of the Doodganga about the fragility of the environment and ill effects of polluting it, besides declaring the banks of the Nallah Dhoodganga and the adjoining areas as 'No Litter Zone'.

The Committee asked the SMC authorities to undertake a massive cleanliness drive in and along the Nallah Doodganga within District Srinagar and ensure effective door to door collection of waste along the Water Body and also take all required measures to prevent dumping of solid waste in it. The committee also asked Municipal Committee Chadoora to clear legacy waste and prevent any further dumping of waste on the Banks of water body.

The Committee also discussed the need of a comprehensive action plan including establishment of STPs of adequate capacity to prevent direct discharge of untreated Sewage into Doodhganga river.

Additional Deputy Commissioner, Srinagar, Assistant Commissioner, Revenue, Srinagar, Tehsildar Headquarter, Srinagar, senior Scientist of PCC Kashmir accompanied the members of the Committee during the visit.

## Assessment camps for Divyangs, Sr Citizens organised

## National Animal Disease Control Programme Phase-II launched

JAMMU: The Department of Animal Husbandry Jammu on Monday officially launched the second phase of the prestigious central sector scheme, National Animal Disease Control Programme for Foot and Mouth Disease in livestock, here at the Directorate complex, Talab Tillo.

The programme aims at vaccinating the entire eligible cattle and buffalo population against the Foot and Mouth Disease in all the districts of the Jammu province.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr Matloob Ahmad Tak, Chief Executive Officer Livestock Development Board, Jammu urged the farmers to take full benefits of the programme and vaccinate their livestock against Foot and Mouth Disease. He said this disease is a serious impediment in the overall growth of the livestock sector and inflicts great economic loss-

es upon the dairy farmers.

Earlier, the programme was launched with flagging off the vehicles containing FMD vaccines from the Directorate complex in the presence of Officers and staff of the Animal Husbandry Department Jammu.

Similar events marking the launch of the vaccination programme were held across all the districts of Jammu province.

It is pertinent to mention

here that the National Animal Disease Control Programme was launched by the Prime Minister, Narendra Modi on September 11, 2019 and envisages control of FMD and Brucellosis diseases in livestock by 2025 and their complete eradication by 2030.

At Ramban Animal Husbandry Department (AHD) Ramban formally launched the 2nd round of National Animal Disease Control Programme (NADCP) in the district to

keep in control foot and mouth disease of animals.

After launching the vaccination drive by vaccinating animals at CAHO complex, the Chief Animal Husbandry Officer Dr Bharat Bhushan Raina informed that the National Animal Disease Control Programme is an initiative taken by the central government in September 2019, to ensure hundred percent vaccinations of cattle.

The CAHO stressed upon the field staff to target and vaccinate 100 percent bovine population of the district in stipulated time. He asked the officers and officials of the department to fully commit themselves to the vaccination drive for the next 45 days.

He informed that around 1.5 lakh bovines will be covered under this program in the district. Apart from vaccination all the animals are to be tagged besides uploading daily data of vaccinated animals on the INAPH portal.

## Intensified Market checking continues in Srinagar

SRINAGAR: In compliance with the already passed directions by the Deputy Commissioner Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz Asad, the special enforcement teams of the District Administration Srinagar on Monday continued the ongoing market checking across the City.

The special Enforcement Squads headed by concerned Tehsildars of the District conducted Intensified market checking in their respective jurisdictions in order to ensure all essential commodities are sold at already fixed prices besides ensuring their quality and availability in City markets.

The concerned Tehsildars in coordination with Police, Legal Metrology, FCS&CA and other Departments carried inspections in Chanapora, Rawalpora, Sanat Nagar and other mar-

kets to curb the black marketing and profiteering in City markets in wake of ensuing winter season and booked several erring shopkeepers.

These shopkeepers were found failing to maintain the quality of food items, not displaying rate lists of essential commodities, selling expiry products, besides indulging in practices of illegal profiteering and sale of under-weight products.

During the market checking, a fine was imposed on the erring vendors, besides huge quantities of expired food items and rotten vegetables were destroyed on the spot. During the checking, the Enforcement teams also asked the traders and vendors to strictly adhere to the Covid-19 SOPs and ensure all customers are wearing masks while making purchases.
