Efforts underway to create better health infra, resources: LG

JAMMU: Referring to the reforms introduced in J&K's health sector in the past three years under the guidance of the Prime Minister, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Friday said that consistent efforts are being made to create better health infrastructure, resources, and reaching out to every citizen of the Union Territory with quality and affordable health care services.

Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha was addressing the 47th Annual Conference of Indian Society of Blood Transfusion & Immunohaematology-Transcon-2022 B. The three-day conference is being organised by ISBTI J&K Chapter and PG Department of Immunohaematology & Transfusion Medicine, Government Medical College, Jammu.

Sinha congratulated the organizers for bringing together transfusion medi-

cine specialists, eminent faculty, experts, and multiple stakeholders from across the country to discuss current trends, recent advances, and future challenges in transfusion medicine.

"One drop of blood covers entire health universe and I am confident such deliberations will enable stakeholders to refine blood transfusion services in the country", said

the Lt Governor.

Observing that our ongoing health research is more focused on reactionary treatment and share of diagnostic research is negligible, the Lt Governor said, we have a huge responsibility to transform the ongoing medical research system and long term investment should be made for developing diagnostic kits.

According to statistics, one out of every fourth person needs blood transfusion at some point in their life and in every two seconds someone in our country needs blood transfusion, the Lt Governor observed.

There is no greater service to humanity than saving a precious life. We need to educate and encourage

trap and was being grilled. Senior police officers were also tight-lipped over the matter and no statement was issued by the ACB till the filing of the report.

Sources in ACB said that there are many complaints of corruption against the police personnel.

Here it is relevant to mention that a corrupt SHO posted in Jammu district recently got a golden coin with 10 Kg apple, 2 Kg sweets and one kg Sund, to oblige a corrupt businessman on whose pay roll he is, as Diwali gift. Many such police officers are still on the payroll of criminals and Anti Corruption Bureau needs to be more vigilant on this.

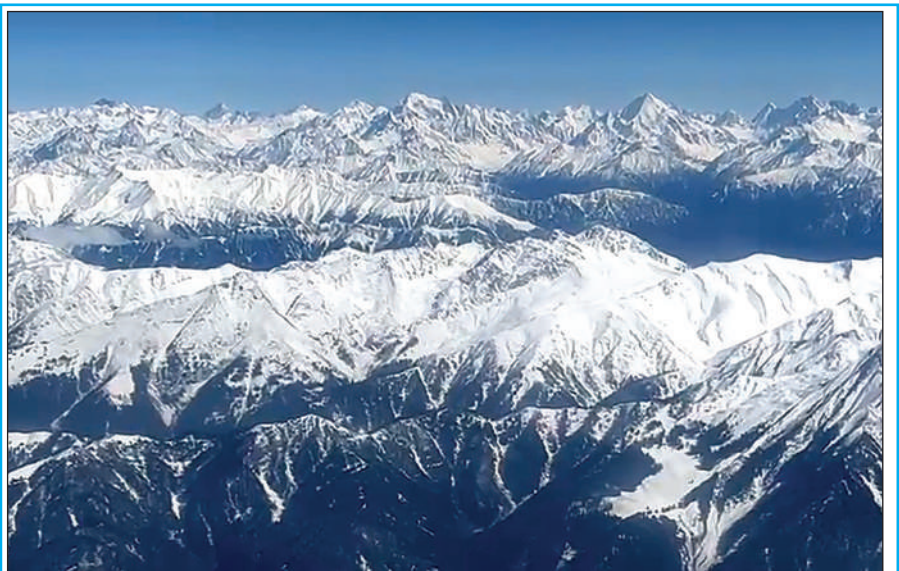
SC extends protection of 'shivling' area in Gyanvapi mosque complex

JeM terrorist killed in Shopian; 4 ultra associates held in Pulwama

SRINAGAR: Security forces on Friday shot dead a foreign terrorist of the Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) in an encounter in Shopian district, police said.

A police spokesman said the security forces, acting on specific information generated by police regarding the presence of terrorist in the Kapren area of Shopian, launched a joint cordon and search operation.

"To avoid any civilian casualty or injury, the joint team

of forces evacuated teachers and students from a nearby madrasa to safer places," he said.

The spokesman said as the search party approached towards the suspected spot, the hiding terrorist fired indiscriminately which was retaliated effectively leading to an encounter.

"In the ensuing encounter, one foreign terrorist, identified as Kamran Bhai @Hanees, linked with proscribed terror outfit JeM was killed and his body was

retrieved from the site of encounter," he said.

According to police records, the killed terrorist was categorised ultra and involved in several terror crime cases, including attacks on police and civilians.

"It is pertinent to mention here that the killed terrorist was active in Kulgam-Shopian area and was trying to revive the terror folds of JeM terror outfit by recruiting & motivating the gullible youth to join terror


whose statements and activities have the potential to create discord in society. I criticise and oppose such policies which can create divisions in the society," he said.


