Meanwhile, as per a handout issued here today, Lieutenant Governor of J&K, Manoj Sinha has consented to declare open the championship. Important to mention here that in the 47th Junior National Volleyball Championship, which was held at Burdwan in West Bengal, Tamil-Nadu won the boys title while Karnataka and Haryana remained second and third respectively.

Similarly, in girls section, West Bengal won the title beating Tamil Nadu in the final. Third place went to Rajasthan.
