journalists Several resigned from local publications recently after being threatened by terror outfit Resistance Front (TRF), a shadow organisation of the Lashker-e-Taiba.

As per the intelligence dossier, "initial assessment suggests that terrorist Mukhtar Baba is the mastermind" behind the threats.

Mukhtar Baba (55) used to work for various newspapers in Kashmir. He was a resident of Srinagar in the 1990s and is believed to have escaped to Turkey, it said.

Baba, who often visits Pakistan, has emerged as a mastermind responsible for grooming youngsters in the Valley to join the TRF,
