"We do have evidence of this kind of thing happening. This is an issue that needs to be discussed because such platforms are being used for raising finances which are being used in terror activities," he said.

The director general said terror financing was a critical issue and it needed to be discussed, be it the traditional modes of funding terror activities like hawala, wire transfers or cash couriers, or the new ways that are developing.

He said the conference comes "back to back" after the recently held Interpol General Assembly and the UN Counter-Terrorism Committee meetings in India.

The DG said all major countries and international organisations like Interpol and Europol were participating in the conference.

Gupta said the conference would have four sessions 'Global Trends in Terrorism and Terrorist Financing', 'Use of Formal and Informal Channels of Funds for Terrorism', 'Emerging Technologies and Terrorist Financing', and International Co-operation to Address Challenges in Combating Terrorist Financing.

The sessions will be chaired by senior ministers, including Home Minister Amit Shah and External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar.

"The two-day conference organised on 18th-19th November will offer a unique platform for participating nations and organisations to deliberate on effectiveness of the current international regime on counter terrorism financing as well as steps required to address emerging challenges," an official statement said.

The conference will build on the previous two meetings held in Paris in April 2018 and Melbourne in November 2019, and work towards enhancing global cooperation to deny finances to terrorists and access to permissive jurisdictions to operate, it said. The event will be attended by about 450 delegates from across the world, including ministers, heads of multilateral organisations and Financial Action Task Force (FATF) heads of delegations.

J&K Govt issues ...

Smita Sethi on Thursday. These allotted units include 462 in Kashmir valley and 124 in Jammu region. These units were granted 500 to 600 acres of land in dozens of industrial estates set up by J&K government.

Of these 423 units were given allotment of lands by J&K Small Scale Industries Development Corporation Limited (SICOP) and 163 by SIDCO.

"As per record 586 allottees (of Industrial units) have not given any response and are liable for cancellation in terms of Jammu & Kashmir Industrial Land Allotment Policy 2021-30 despite repeated notices", Sethi said in final and show-cause notice for cancellation of the allotment order.

The notice further said that as per the directions of administrative department of Industries and Commerce on November 4, 2022, a final notice of 15 days is being served to all the (389) allottees from the date of issuance of this notice, who did not respond to earlier notices, to deposit the payment and complete formalities.

"Failing which it shall be presumed that they have nothing to say in their defence and the allotment order shall be deemed to have been cancelled or withdrawn ab-initio, if no convincing response is received during this period", Sethi said.

She further said that in accordance procedural guideline to the Jammu & Kashmir industrial land allotment policy, 30 days notice was served upon the unit holders, who failed to deposit the payment and complete the requisite formalities.

"Additionally a show cause notice of seven days and final notice of five days was also served through email. They again failed to deposit the due amount and complete the necessary formalities", MD said.

"There are 4500 applications in queue for grant of allotment in setting up units in J&K. If they don't respond, there are others in the queue", Sethi told PTI.

These units are bringing an investment of over Rs 3,000 crores and generating a job market of 7,000.

As per the notice SIDCO and SICOP issued land allotments or letter of intent (LOIs) in terms of Industrial Policy 2021-30 in compliance to the approval accorded by high level land allotment committee in its first meeting held on July 1, 2021 & December 30, 2021.

As per terms and conditions of allotment orders, the allottees were required to deposit the land premium, execute lease deed and complete other formalities within 60 days time frame from the date of issuance of said allotment order. However some unit holders have failed to deposit the due amount & complete the necessary formalities within the stipulated time period, Sethi said.

Jammu & Kashmir Land Allotment Policy, 2021-30 provides land allotment process and envisages that in case of non-execution of lease deed, including non-payment of payable premium, even after the expiry of notice period, the land allotment shall be cancelled by the concerned industrial development corporation immediately, she said.

As per the procedural guidelines, allotment policy provide that in case of failure on the part of allottees to make total payment towards premium within stipulated time from the date of allotment letter, violation of any condition of the lease deed, failure to come into production within stipulated time, among others, the concerned estates officer shall immediately take necessary action for determination of the lease deed and eviction of the allottees under the said act and rules made there under.

Jammu and Kashmir has received investment proposals worth Rs 31,000 crore and has notified a new central sector scheme worth Rs 28,400 crore which is likely to provide employment to over 4.5 lakh people, the Rajya Sabha was informed in December last year. MoS Home Nityanand Rai said that the government has received investment proposals worth approximately Rs 31,000 crore.

The Minister and Chief Justice of J&K and Ladakh High Court, Justice Ali Mohammad Magrary interacted with beneficiaries of various schemes and distributed certificates and cheques among them.

In his speeches at different programs during the day Chief Justice of Jammu Kashmir and Ladakh, Justice Ali Mohammad Magray said that access to Justice is not confined to the court based legal services. It extends to making people aware about their entitlements under various enactments and welfare schemes and programmes and strengthening their access to the same.

He said the State Legal Services Authority and various District Legal Service Authorities have played a pivotal part to ensure people have access to legal advice. He said that the Legal Services Authorities will continue to organise legal services camps in the villages.

Chief Justice said Students Legal Literacy Clubs' are being formed with an aim to spread knowledge of the legal rights and duties among the students who in turn can raise awareness among the poor and needy to not only mitigate their problems but to get out of problems absolutely.

He said that the Legal Literacy and legal services programmes are essential as it is the knowledge of the law that can be used as a tool by vulnerable groups to understand and evaluate the law, to get acquainted with the scope of their rights under the law, and get their rights enforced by taking action and bringing the legal machinery into force.

He further added that being a part of the largest democracy, knowledge of law serves the people with the tool of power and self-realization and unless the people are aware of rights, they cannot live in consonance with the true dictates of democracy and rule of law.

services (HJS) examination held recently in Rajasthan.

Refusing to entertain the plea, the bench, also comprising Justices Hima Kohli and J B Pardiwala, asked the candidates to approach the high court instead.

The court said it is of the considered view that such a challenge can be raised under Article 226 of the Constitution in the Rajasthan High Court.

"The counsel, Prashant Bhushan, submitted that the answer sheets be evaluated by a former judge... We leave it open to the petitioners to move the Rajasthan High Court. We request the Chief Justice of the High Court to constitute a bench if such a petition is filed," the bench said.

At the outset, the CJI said, "We are not getting candidates (lawyers) for lateral entry into the higher judicial services across the country. I can tell you this from my experience in Maharashtra and in the Allahabad High Court that we do not find candidates. We would like lawyers to join the higher judicial services."

The CJI said chief justices of different high courts tell him they do not find enough lawyers who wanted to serve in HJS through lateral entry.

The lawyers, who had appeared in the Rajasthan HJS, wanted quashing of the final result which was declared on October 21 and re-evaluation of the answer sheets by a former judge of the Supreme Court.

The Rajasthan higher judicial services examination was held for appointment of 85 additional district judges in the state.

Over 3,000 lawyers had appeared in the preliminary examination and later, 779 successful candidates among them took up the main examination, Bhushan said.

However, only four candidates were called for interview in the final round, he said, adding this was a serious issue that needed to be examined by the apex court which can appoint a former judge to re-evaluate the answer sheets.

Love Jihad: Why...

Tila Morh; in June 2020, a Dalit girl Shivani Khobiyaan of Haryana killed by Arif for denying his marriage proposal; in February 2021, Layeeq Khan used a hammer to brutally murder Hindu girl Neetu for refusing his marriage proposal in the Begum Vihar area of Rohini in North West Delhi; in April 2021, Haider Ali along with his friends slit the throat of Nidhi in Krishna Nagar; Uttarakhand after she refused his marriage proposal, in September 2021, National-level kho-kho player Babli Rani (24) was strangled to death in Bijnor; UP by railway labourer Shahzad (26) after she resis-

ted his attempt to rape her; in April 2022, Azhar slit the throat of Anusha, a 23-year-old girl, in Hanamkonda, Hyderabad as he was angered by her rejection of his proposal for a relationship; in August 2022: Arman Ali along with his friends allegedly shot a girl studying in Standard XI because she had stopped talking to him after knowing that he is a Muslim. These and counting goes on.

Astonishingly, those encouraging 'Love Jihad', show pitiable intolerance when Muslim girls married Hindu boys and condoned barbaric deaths of the male partners or the couples in some cases. A Dalit boy Sonu and Muslim girl Dhanishta were hacked to death allegedly by the girl's family in 2014 in Hapur for having affair; 18-year-old Delhi University student Rahul Rajput was killed by Muslim girl's brother and his friends; Lakshmiopathy was murdered by his Muslim girlfriend's family in Karnataka's Rammagara; father and son killed daughter Reshma Banu (20) and her Hindu lover K Nagaraj (18) in Karnataka's Hampasagara in Hagaribonmanahalli on March 24, 2017; two minors-Mukesh Kumar and Noor Jehan were killed by the girls' brother and uncles in West Bihar's Champaran in 2017; upset over interfaith marriage, Muslim woman's cousin hacked Vijay Shankar Yadav and Sufiya Abrar Mansuri, aka Priya Yadav (22) in UP's Hardoe district in April 2015; Youth Congress leader Balakrishnan was killed for marrying a Muslim woman in Kerala's Kasargod; Jithu Mohan of Kerala was set ablaze by Muslim girl's brother-in-law for his romantic liaison with a Muslim girl in Kochi in October 2012; in August 2018, a Muslim woman was strangled and mutilated by her father and brother in Purba Burdwan district for being in a relationship with a Hindu man; a Muslim woman allegeded her family hatched a conspiracy with the help of police to eliminate her Hindu husband Rajneesh Sharma of Sarwal area of Jammu on the intervening night of September 29-30; a Kangaroo court executes a Hindu man Shailendra Prasad for marrying a Muslim woman Munera Bibi in Mumbai in August 2008; in October 2018, an 18-year-old Muslim girl was tied up to a tree and beaten up for hours just because she eloped away with a Hindu man in Bihar; Ankit Saxena was murdered in broad daylight in Delhi by the family of his Muslim girlfriend Shehzadi on February 1, 2018; Dalit Man Khetrnam Bhim(22) was beaten to death in Rajasthan because he fell in love with a Muslim girl in Barmer village of Rajasthan in 2018; Jaideep Garwa in Bhuj was clobbered to death with sharp-edged weapons for being in love with a Muslim girl; Sanjay Kumar was killed by Muslim ex-wife's family in Faridabad in Faridabad of the National Capital Region in August 2018; 9 years after their marriage, Brijesh was killed by her Muslim wife's family members in Allahabas village in December 2019; Kripalsinh Jadeja was stabbed to death over a love affair with a Muslim girl in January 2020 in Shikarpur village of Bhachau in Kutch (Source: OpIndia: October 13, 2020).

India's first privately...

Skyroot Aerospace has become the first private company in India to give wings to the Indian space programme, after the sector was opened to private players by the Centre in 2020.

The lift off of the first Vikram-S rocket has been scheduled at 11.30 am with clear weather paving the way for the launch as against the earlier planned November 15.

Vikram-S will soar to an altitude of 81 km after its launch from Satish Dhawan Space Centre. The launch vehicle has been named so as a tribute to the father of Indian Space programme, the late Vikram Sarabhai.

The Mission titled 'Prarambhi' (the beginning) would carry three payloads belonging to two domestic customers and a foreign client.

The six-meter tall rocket is one of the world's first few all-composite rockets that has 3-D printed solid thrusters for spin stability of the launch vehicle, a Skyroot functionary said. The launch of the rocket is expected to demonstrate flight proving of avionics systems in Vikram series like telemetry, tracking, inertial measurement, Global Positioning System, on-board camera, data acquisition and power systems.

India's space regulator IN-SPACe on Wednesday authorised the launch of Skyroot's Vikram-S sub-orbital vehicle. "This is a giant leap for the private space sector in India. Congratulations to Skyroot for becoming the first Indian company to be authorised for launching a rocket," Indian National Space Promotion and Authorisation Centre Chairman Pawan Goenka said.
