JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court comprising Chief Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey and Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul directed Commissioner/ Secretary to Government of Tourism Department to file affidavit, indicating steps taken for ensuring compliance of order passed on 22.07.2022 whereby it was directed to frame a policy in order to address and resolve slew of issues of famous tourist resort Gulmarg and directed Government to inform the Court with a comprehensive report regarding all issues.

When PIL Came-up for hearing, DB observed that in terms of order passed on 22.07.2022, the Court had detailed consideration of matter based on material available, identified vital and important issues/matters, which required attention/decision on priority. "We have noticed from the record of the proceedings that notwithstanding the Master Plan in place for Gulmarg, the following vital and important issues/matters are required to be addressed to at priority like formulation of a vision document based on the considerations like Environment, Forest Lands, average number of tourists visiting in Gulmarg, existing hotels with bed capacities, sanitation, installation of bio digesters etc.

When matter was taken up for consideration, Ilyas Nazir Laway, GA invited attention of the Court to compliance filed by the Chief Executive Officer, Gulmarg Development Authority, which having reference to the endeavour of seeking

etc. In respect of Hotels/Hutments and other structures existing in and around Gulmarg Bowl having come up either with or without permission of the authorities and requiring repairs and maintenance on account of harsh weather conditions during winter; cases where lease has expired and hotels/hutments and other structures are existing thereupon and as to whether Government proposes to extend lease in such cases and if so on what terms and conditions and in case said lease is not agreed to be extended how the hotels/hutments and other structures existing thereupon the land wherein the lease has expired would be dealt with; whether any area is clearly earmarked/demarcated for raising of construction of hotels/hutments/structures and the manner and method the said unbuilt area (s) have to be dealt with; How the areas beyond the areas notified under Master Plan are to be handled and treated; How to attend immediate needs of the people living in Gulmarg, using their residential properties."

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
