

DSEJ trains 61 teachers as Master Trainers on art based tools for social, emotional learning of students

JAMMU: In order to impart Social Emotional Learning among students and teachers, Directorate of School Education, Jammu (DSEJ) in collaboration with Piramal Foundation (Kaivalya Education Foundation) and Red Pencil International trained a cadre of 61 teaching faculty as Master Trainers under the Art-based Capacity Building Training project.

The training was imparted by international trainers (viz; Yen Chua from Singapore, Renu Thomas from UAE Latika Joshi from Tanzania, and Roshni Bhatia).

The training was completed in 6 months, in two phases. The first phase comprised of an Introduction Training of 3 months and on the job coaching of 3 months in second phase, through hybrid mode (virtual plus offline).

administrative and academic terms as many of the provisions of bill are retrogressive in nature and against academic freedom of the University.

Dr. Rakesh Chib President JUNTEU termed the bill as the intention of the Government to erode the autonomy of Universities. KD Singh President NTEA-J also spoke on the occasion.

After giving a patient hearing, Dr. Abdullah said that

HC refuses to quash Preliminary Enquiry against KAS officer in disproportionate assets case

JAMMU: Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul has refused to quash Preliminary Enquiry Verification No.09/2022 of Anti-Corruption Bureau (NK) in a disproportionate assets case against a lady KAS officer. A petition was filed by a woman KAS officer, the then BDO Singhpora Pattan District Baramulla before the High Court at Srinagar on 28-08-2022 alleging therein that Enquiry officer, one DySP rank officer and SP ACB North Kashmir are harassing her since 2018 and she had prayed that proceeding initiated against her by ACB in verification No. 09/2022 for possessing disproportionate assets are not as per laid down law and may be quashed etc.

On 28-08-2022, High Court had initially passed following interim order that the respondents are directed not to undertake any further verification in respect of the complaint which is the sub-

which are being thoroughly probed and the lady has resorted to false allegations of sexual harassment to shield Mohd Shafi also who is involved in two FIRs already registered against him at Anti-corruption Bureau and Crime branch J & K and a separate probe for possessing assets disproportionate to his legal source of income in Verification No. 06/2022. The Court after listening to the arguments of both sides reserved its judgement on 30-09-2022 and finally pronounced its order on 17-11-2022. In its concluding Para's of order the court observed that section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, preserves the inherent powers of the High Court to prevent an abuse of the process of any court or to secure the ends of justice. "The provision does not confer new powers. It only recognises and preserves powers which are inherent in the High Court. The High Court, while forming an opinion

whether a criminal proceeding or complaint or FIR should be quashed in exercise of its jurisdiction under Section 482 Cr. P.C., must evaluate whether the ends of justice would justify the exercise of the inherent power. While inherent power of the High Court has a wide ambit and plenitude, it has to be exercised to secure ends of justice or to prevent an abuse of the process of any court," the Court observed, adding that instant petition, when looked from all angles, requires and demands full dress trial and examination of facts by this Court as if it is in appeal and acting as an appellate court and to draw its own conclusion vis-à-vis impugned FIR, complaint and proceedings emanating there from. "For the reasons discussed above, the instant petition is without any merit and is, accordingly, dismissed with connected CM(s). Interim direction, if any, shall stand vacated," the Court directed.

DB disposed of PIL against charging of tuition, transport fee from Aug-2019 onwards till normal class-work resumes

JAMMU: In a PIL filed by Sheikh Umar Farooq against charging of tuition fee, bus fee or any other sought of incidental fee charged from parents by any educational institute from August-2019 onwards till normal class work resumes, a Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Comprising Chief Justice Ali

Mohammad Magrey and Justice Vinod Chatterji Koul, disposed of the PIL with directions that the grievance, if any, of any of the individual parent can be addressed to by approaching Committee/Government. This significant order has been passed by the Division Bench after Additional Advocate General submitted that the grievances of the

petitioner stands settled by formation of Committee for Fixation of Fee Structure of Private Educational Institutions, J&K. The Committee is said to be issuing the orders from time to time to regulate the matters within its ambit and the Committee is providing hearing to the various parent bodies as also the School associations, the Court observed.
