The stone walls leading to the village have the pictures of Lord Buddha and Saints like 'Wajar Pani' made on them. You will also find flags of white cloth fluttering along the path and also on the roof tops named as 'Darshod'. The flags have the pictures of

'Munnies' and also some edicts written on them. Buddhists believe that these flags keep the evil spirits at bay and don't allow these to afflict Buddhists-homes. Buddhists are deeply religious, god-fearing and possess virtues like truthfulness, simplicity, honesty and piousness. Their places of worship are called 'GUMPAS' and their religion heads as 'Lamas'.

Every 'Gumpa' on its entry gate, has a revolving wheel

known as 'Dharm Chakra' fitted on the pillars. The devotees have to rotate it with the belief that it rids them of their misfortune. The devotees pray in front of the large sized idols of Lord Buddha, Munnies and Goddesses led by the Lama.
